THE PRICE PAID for Kent County bonds this week was certainly flattering as to the financial condition of the county. The premium offered places Kent's bonds on a par with Federal government bonds. The fact that the bonds were short term and non-callable enhanced their value. The County Commissioners are to be congratulated on being able to secure a loan at a rate of interest that nets only 2.74 per cent.

From a talk with many Kent County veterans as to what they expected to do with their bonus money we find that there is little danger of its being squandered. Among the replies to the question "What are you going to do with your bonus money?" we found the majority were going to pay debts, other replies included heating plants for their homes, start the purchase of a home, make improvements on their homes, save the bonds and cash them as and when needed. NEW YORK PLAY TO BE PRESENTED NEXT WEEK

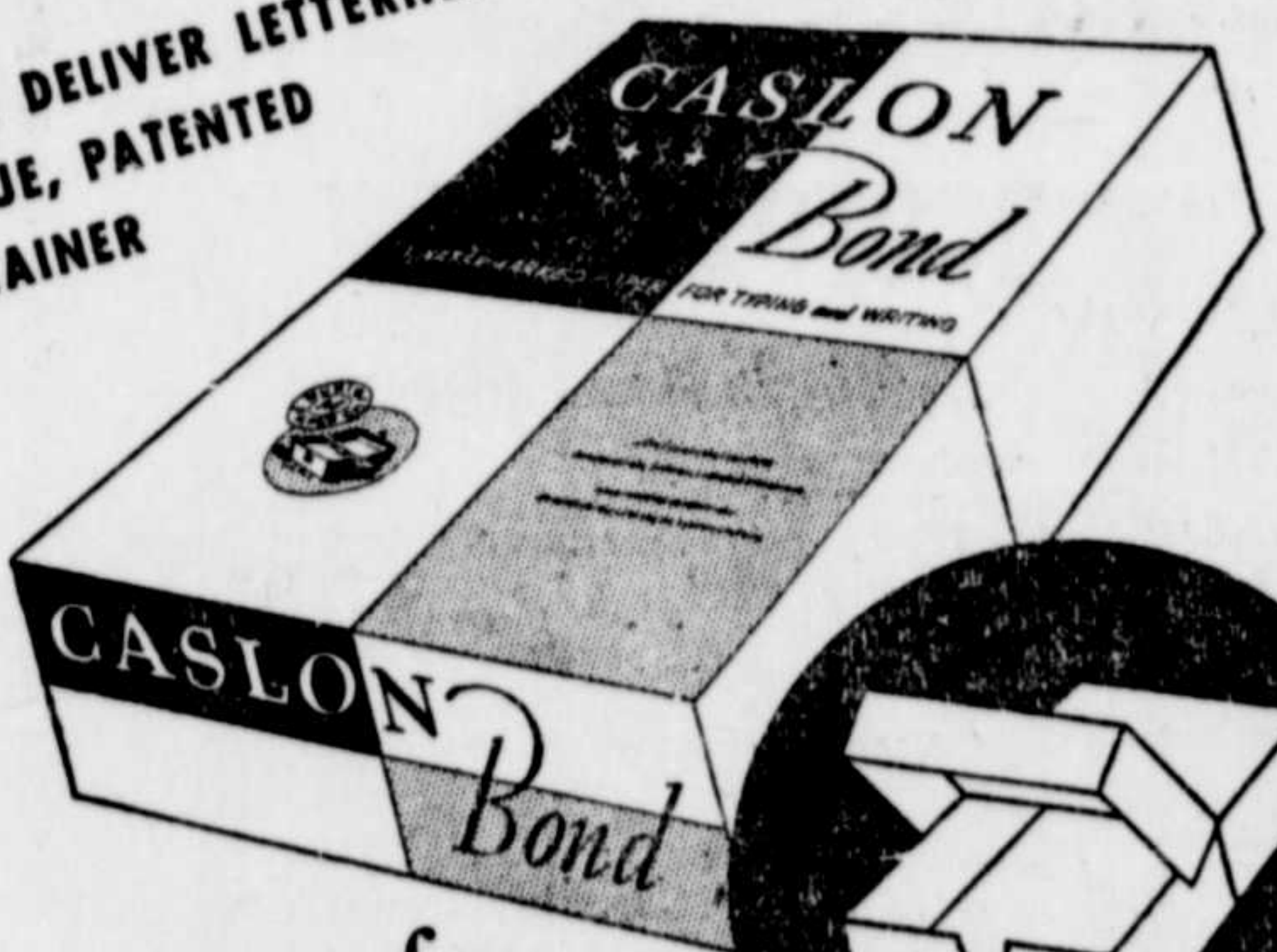

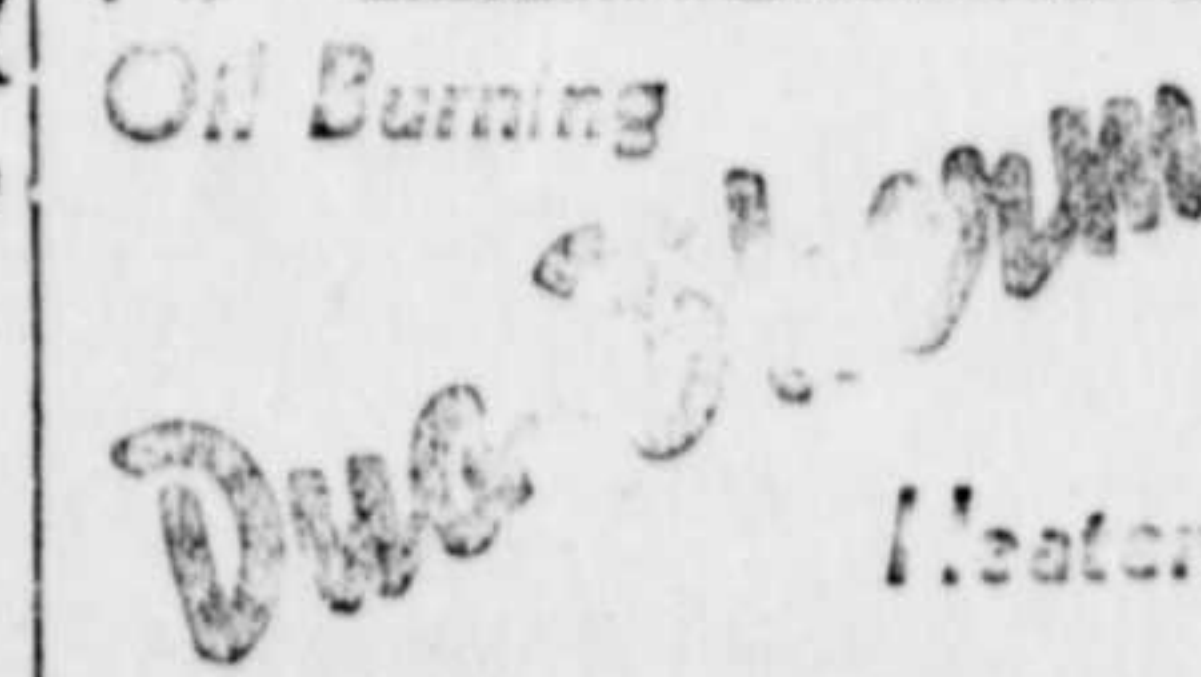
