The TRANSCRIPT is cooperating in a Shore-wide Safety Campaign starting this week. The campaign, designed to aid in reducing highway deaths and accidents, which in 1935 took three lives in this county, 78 on the Shore and 521 in the State, is designed to appeal to every motorist.

This newspaper will distribute windshield stickers, bearing on the face a "Red Star of Safety" with the pledge "I Will Obey Traffic Laws" and on the reverse a list of five safety rules. The stickers are to be given to any motorist who calls at this office. The campaign is also being conducted through filling stations, garages, the Red Star Lines, and a majority of the Eastern Shore newspapers.

Cecil county had the highest accident and death rate of the Eastern Shore with 20 fatal accidents and 20 deaths recorded during the past year. Wicomico was second, having 12 fatal accidents and 17 deaths and Dorchester third with 14 fatal accidents and 15 deaths.
