Waterway Projects For Worcester County

Funds totaling \$45,000 for two Worcester County waterways improvement projects were allotted last Thursday by the U. S. War Department at Washington, D. C., to be expended in the next twelve months. The two county projects aided are as follows: \$32,000 for maintenance dredging to restore the channel in the Pocomoke River between Shad Landing and Snow Hill, a distance of five miles. \$13,000 for maintenance dredging of accumulated sand deposits and jetty restoration work in the Ocean City Inlet and Synepent Bay channel leading to the Inlet.

Ocean City's municipal tax rate was reduced from \$1 to 85 cents on the \$100 at a meeting of the Mayor and Council of Ocean City held on Tuesday of this week.

Prisoners Overcome When Jail Burns

Four prisoners in Aberdeen's one-story jail owe their lives to firemen who rescued them from the blazing building. The jail was practically destroyed by the fire, cause of which was not determined. Chief Raymond Budnick and W. J. Toal led other firemen through the dense smoke to rescue the four prisoners. Two of them were unconscious, overcome by smoke. The inmates were awaiting trial on charges of minor offenses.

Waterspout Seen On Bay

A giant waterspout swirled across the Susquehanna flats at the head of the Chesapeake Bay near the Aberdeen Proving Ground Wednesday. A strong northeast wind pushed it along. It was several hundred feet in diameter. Flashes of lightning and heavy rain accompanied the spout.

150 Boats To Attend Regatta

Commander R. D. E. Smith, of the United States Power Squadron, has indicated that this squadron of 150 boats will rendezvous at the Miles River Regatta this year.

Five thousand rural boys and girls in Maryland have joined with a million others in the United States with Heads pledged to Clearer Thinking, Hearts to Greater Loyalty, Hands to Larger Service, Health to Better Living for club, community and Country as their standard and to make the "Best Better" as their goal.

should be your boys and girls if they are between the ages of ten and twenty.

Each club member is required to conduct a demonstration in agriculture or homemaking under the supervision of the County or Home Demonstration Agent and agree to keep an account of the time and cost of enterprise.

Things worthwhile require effort and usually some expenditure of money. For example, for John to successfully conduct a poultry demonstration he should have certain feed, proper feeder and watering troughs. These cost money. Does John have it available?

Mary, perhaps, will need some quart jars with glass tops to can. Are they available? These are merely suggestions, but it is a fact that every worthwhile project requires some financial consideration. On the other hand, the net profit from the club demonstration will be in direct proportion to the club member's efforts and ability.

Which is worth more, the inspiration and determination of your boy and girl or the small amount of money necessary for the successful completion of the demonstration?

Ownership is Essential to Thrift. To further encourage the boys and girls they should be given the profits from their work after expenses have been deducted. Nothing could do more to destroy initiative and to discourage thrift than to be deprived of ownership.

That is exactly what happens when John's calf becomes Dad's cow and Mary's chicken Mother's hens.

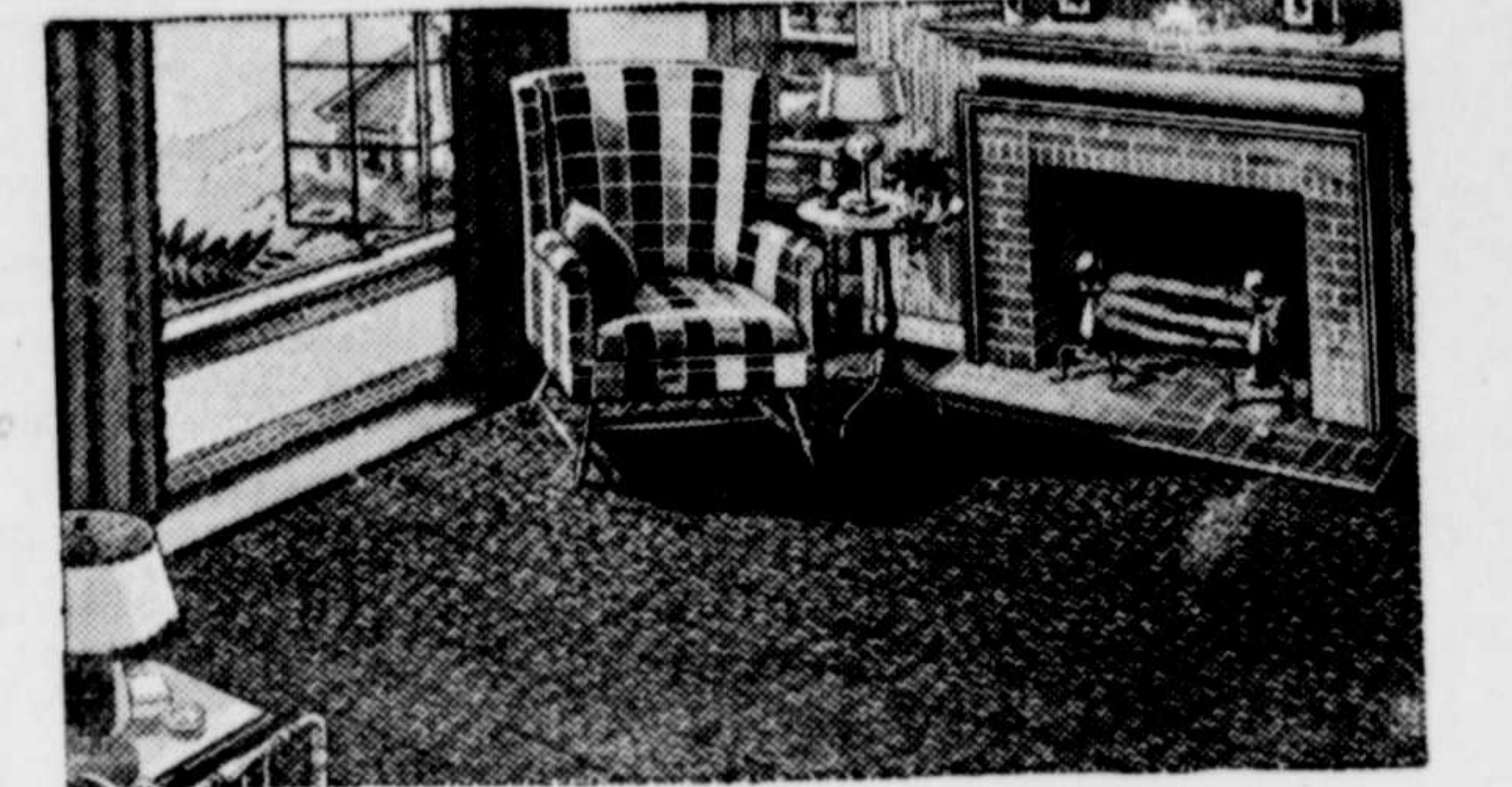

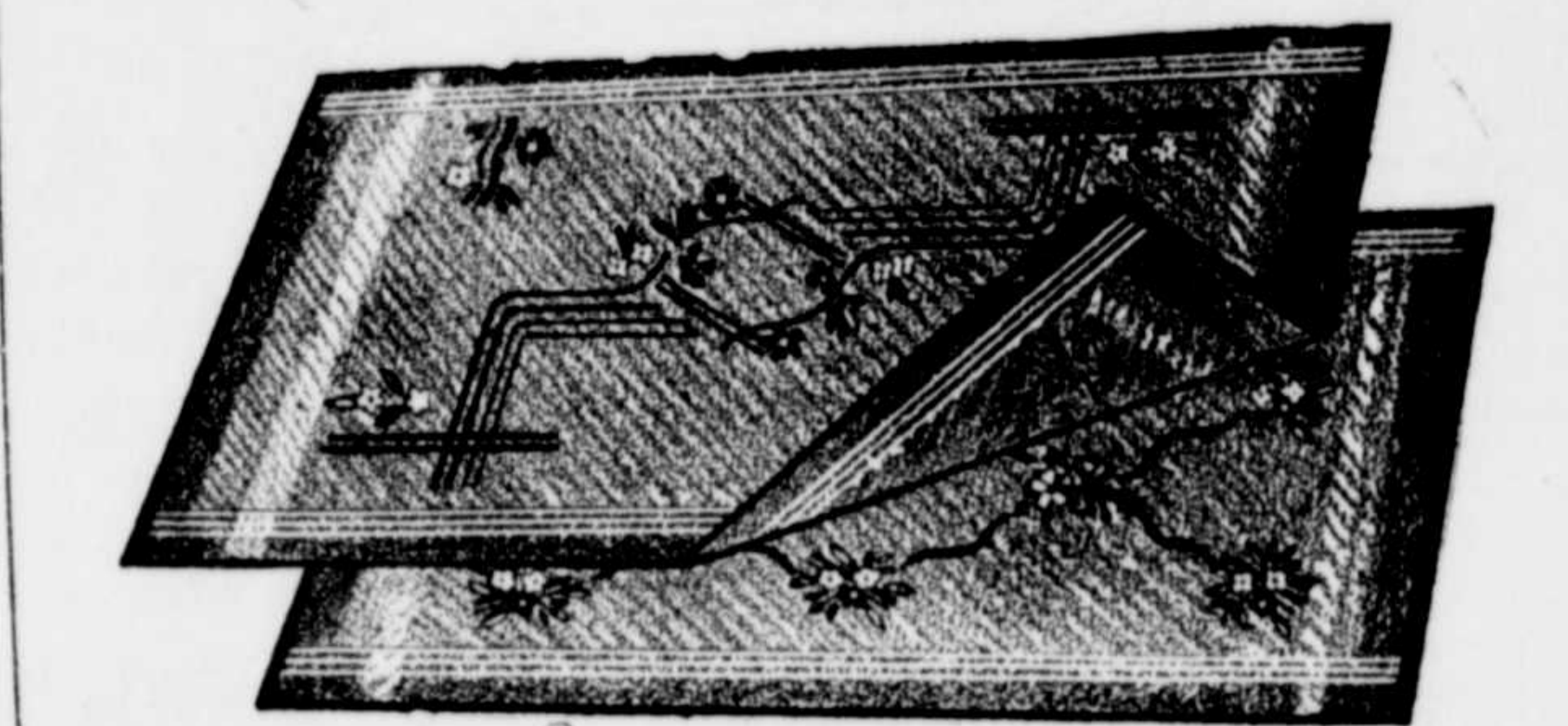
