PUBLIC MEETING CALLED TO DISCUSS A NEW HIGH SCHOOL IN CHESTERTOWN

Commissioners And School Board Hold Joint Meeting On Tuesday Of This Week

W. P. A. BASED ON PUBLIC OPINION

The Commissioners of Kent County and the Kent County School Board met in joint session on Tuesday of this week for the purpose of discussing the need of a new High School in Chestertown. This meeting followed a petition from the School Board to the Commissioners requesting a W. P. A. application for \$200,000 for a new white school here and \$30,000 for a new colored school.

The assessor's basis of the county before the application will be made. The letter, calling the meeting, is as follows: Chestertown, Maryland, July 12, 1938. To the Taxpayers of Kent County, Maryland: It is generally conceded that the need for a new high school building to accommodate adequately and comfortably the white high school children living throughout the middle section of Kent and constituting three-fifths of the high school population of the county is very urgent. The need for an adequate high school building for the colored youth throughout the county is quite as urgent.
