ACCORDING TO information received this week, there is apparently a misunderstanding as to the time in which applications must be made for Public Works Administration projects. It was generally believed that the deadline was August 2nd but according to P. W. A. Officials the deadline is not until September 30th. These officials further stated that in many places where the vote of the people is desired, an application has been filed pending the result of the referendum. In cases of this kind the application may be approved by the P. W. A. without any obligation on the part of the sponsor to carry out the project. There is no expense connected with the filing of the application with the exception that it must be accompanied by a preliminary sketch showing the project desired. Many people have confused the P. W. A. with the W. P. A. under which a number of projects have been completed in the county. The P. W. A. is not confined to relief labor but is an outright grant of forty five percent of all costs of the project. A contract is let similar to any other construction project and the government pays its proportionate share of the cost of land, material, labor and architect's fee. With these facts it is not necessary that the Chestertown High School project be dropped, particularly in view of the fact that all objections to the project requested that a vote be taken by the people of the county. It is further understood that many of the objectors would consent to a correction of the present overcrowded conditions of the Chestertown High School but are opposed to a \$200,000 new school. We believe that the Commissioners of Kent County could justly apply for a W. P. A. grant of a sufficient fund to correct the present overcrowded conditions at this school, subject to the approval of the people of the county which they represent. There is a grave doubt that the new school project would pass which would mean four more years at least of education in this school under the handicapped conditions that now exist. We further believe that a reasonable sum for the improvement of these conditions, if properly and unbiasedly put before the voters, would have a good chance of being approved. This is apparently the most logical solution to the problem. The objection to the increase in taxes might be met by having the improvement bonds start maturing in 1942 when the present road bond will have been paid off which would still permit a much reduced tax rate.

STATE OFFICE FOR EMPLOYMENT AID IN NEW OFFICE

Moves From Voshel House To Wroth Building

On Monday, July 25, 1938, the Maryland State Employment Office which has been located in the Voshel Hotel since December 1937, will be removed to the Transcript Building on Court Street, Chestertown, Maryland. The office will be open daily except on each Tuesday and the first Thursday in every month until further notice. Hours for registration and filing claims will be from 8.30 a. m. to 4 p. m. daily except Saturdays when the office closes at noon, and with the exceptions of the days mentioned.

Oren B. Harrison who has been acting manager of the Chestertown office will have charge of a new office in Elkton, Maryland beginning July 23 and Mrs. Nell C. Westcott will be the staff member in the Chestertown Office.

Mrs. Westcott states that there is a great demand for good domestic workers particularly for white women as working-companions or housekeepers and for colored domestics and couples on farms.

Those interested in securing positions in the New Hosiery Plant are making applications through the Employment Service and applicants meeting the qualifications of the operators of the plant will be referred as soon as the order is given.

All employers are cordially invited to make use of the Employment Service where selection of workers may be made from qualified men and women. This service is without cost to the employer or employee and the cooperation of the general public can do so far in helping reduce local unemployment.

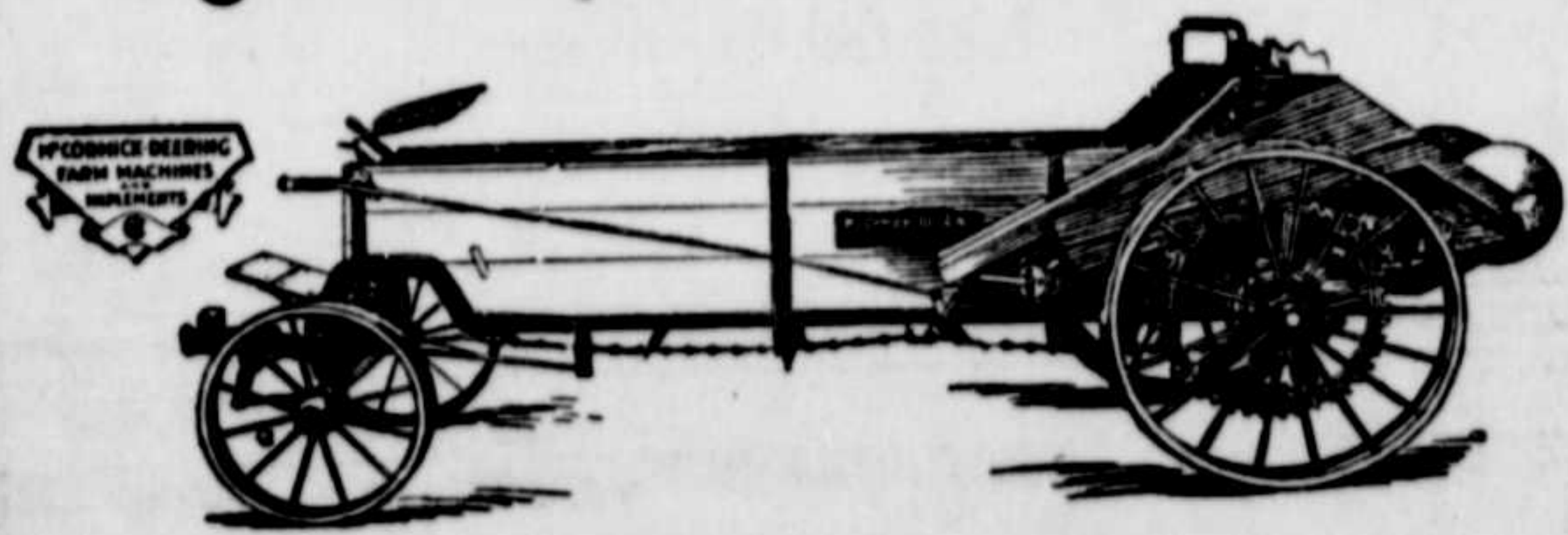
