KENT COUNTY FREE FROM DIPHTHERIA SO FAR THIS YEAR

No Deaths From Typhoid Reported For First Nine Months

Six of the twenty-three Counties of Maryland, including Kent had an entirely clean slate with respect to diphtheria, during the first nine months of the current year, with neither sickness nor deaths from this arch enemy of childhood, up to the end of September. Nineteen counties reported some sickness from diphtheria, but no deaths from the disease, between January 1, and September 30 of this year. The counties on this honor roll are:

Kent, Allegany, Calvert, Queen Anne's, Talbot, Worcester.

There is an honor list for typhoid as well as for diphtheria. Thirteen counties including Kent have had no deaths from typhoid charged against them, so far, this year.

In announcing the honor lists for these two diseases, Dr. R. H. Riley, Director of the State Department of Health, spoke of the encouraging decreases that have occurred in both typhoid and diphtheria, over a period of years. He compared the totals for 1938 with those recorded ten years

ago. "Our records show" he said "that over 700 cases and 86 deaths from typhoid occurred in the State in 1928. There were more than 1,500 cases and over 100 deaths from diphtheria the same year."
