

ON THE SCREEN AT THE NEW LYCEUM



A dramatic story of the life and loves of a young interne in a big city brings Lew Ayres and Lynne Carver to the New Lyceum screen starting Monday and Tuesday, December 19 and 20 in "Young Dr. Kildare." Lionel Barrymore has a prominent part in the action of the new film and the cast also features Nat Pendleton, Jo Ann Sayers and Samuel S. Hinds.

Lew Ayres' sensational return to the screen spotlight continues. With Lionel Barrymore, he is featured in "Young Dr. Kildare" which shows at the New Lyceum Theatre on Monday and Tuesday, December 19 and 20. Lynne Carver has the feminine lead.

Ayres' performances in "Holiday" and "Rich Man, Poor Girl" resulted virtually in demand performances by this young veteran whose unforgettable work in "All Quiet on the Western Front" zoomed him to stardom ten years ago. Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer answered the demand by placing him under contract and casting him immediately as Kildare. Barrymore plays the grizzled diagnostician, Dr. Gillespie, who is at once the nemesis and mentor of the amazing young Kildare.

"Young Dr. Kildare" is the story of a young medical student who sacrifices love and a place of comparative security beside his country doctor father to achieve something great for humanity. As an interne in the general hospital of a big city, his independent thinking gets him fired from the staff, but wins him the admiration of Gillespie, the great diagnostician. Kildare returns home to find that through Gillespie, love and a career are not incompatible.

The cast supporting Ayres, Barrymore and Miss Carver includes Nat Pendleton, Jo Ann Sayers, and Samuel S. Hinds. The picture was directed by Harold S. Bucquet, winner of last year's award of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences for the crime short, "Torture Money." "Flirting With Fate," new Joe E. Brown starring picture, opens on Wednesday and Thursday, December 21 and 22 at the New Lyceum Theatre.

Joe E. Brown, veteran stage and screen comedian, plays the role of manager and star attraction of a vaudeville troupe touring South America. With him in the big cast is Lew Carroll, the best loved bad man of the screen in a characterization which offers him every opportunity for a display of the talents which have made him one of the top-ranking character players in Hollywood.

Beverly Roberts has the feminine lead opposite Brown, while Wynne Gibson is given another important featured role. Steffi Duna, who won fame through the short subject, "La Cucaracha," dances in the picture. Others in the cast include Charles Judels, Stanley Fields, Leonid Kisey and Irene Franklin.

Frank McDonald, for seventeen years an actor and director on Broadway and for the past three years a motion picture director, handles the megaphone. David L. Loew produced.

"Flirting with Fate" is a story of the hilarious adventures which befall Brown and his troupe when they find themselves stranded in the capital of a South American country. Brown, believing his insurance will save the troupe, after pits to end it all. That careful, he learns, just as he is about to be executed, that his troupe can save a year's tour of the biggest South American circuit.

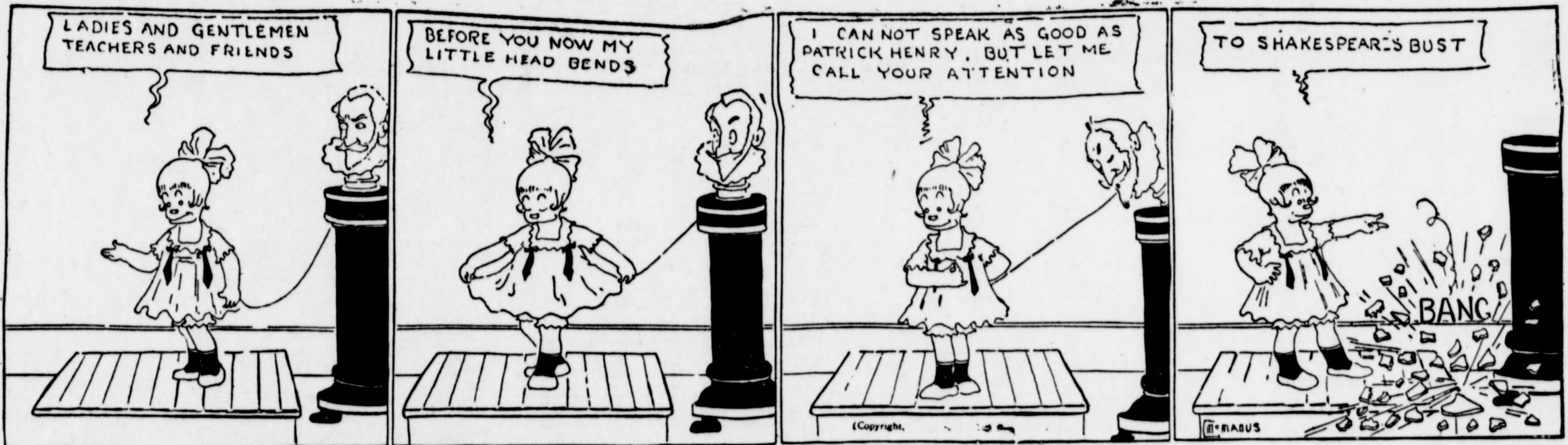

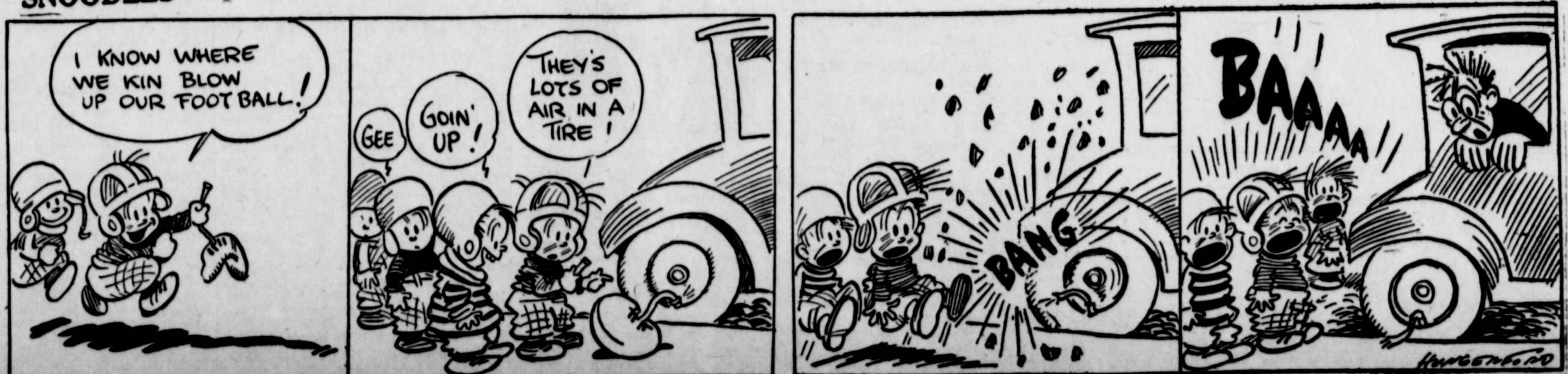
