

THE TRANSCRIPT

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THE COMING SESSION of the Maryland Legislature which convenes January 3rd, promises to be a very interesting one in view of the many changes in the present setup that were advocated during the campaign. Prominent among the changes is that of the State Roads Commission, and Governor O'Connor has advocated the stopping of diverting gasoline tax funds from road use and the appointment of officials, as far as he is able, according to their ability and training. The following comment on this phase of government in the State of Maryland appeared as an editorial in the Engineering News, one of the outstanding engineering magazines of the country:

"One of the straws of the pre-election campaign pointed to a growing understanding of road matters. Heretofore highway department patronage has figured in state campaigns, but a more worthy issue was raised in Maryland, where the rival candidates for Governor challenged each other on the efficiency of road administration. There were charges of wasting money in roadbuilding and maintenance and in allowing roads to deteriorate; whether or not they were true, the very fact that they were brought up shows that the road has become so commanding a part of the state's service to the public as to claim major place among campaign issues. This is significant because it means that public attention is being focussed on road expenditures, which in turn promises better planning and more efficient planning of roads. Once the taxpayer and voter comes to understand all about the highway dollar, its source in the road tax and its product in highway service, sound road policies will be assured."

Another important State Department which is drawing attention all over the State is the Conservation Department. The Outdoor Life Federation has prepared a conservation program which would entirely change the present system. This organization has a large membership in all parts of the State. At a recent meeting of watermen and packers another program of conservation was advocated. Efforts are now being made to coordinate the plans of these two large organizations which would add considerable weight when presented to the Legislature.

Robert Wickes, formerly of Kent County, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Francis Hastings, at Cherrydale, Va., Thursday evening. He was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James P. Wickes and formerly lived at "Wickliffe" on Eastern Neck Island. He was a descendant of the original settlers of this section who first located on Eastern Neck Island. SUMMARY SHOWS REPRESENTATION FROM DISTRICTS

Every District Represented By County Officials

Now that all newly elected County officials have taken office with the exception of the State's Attorney and Treasurer, a summary of the representation from the various districts together with the assessments of both real and personal in those districts is as follows:

First District—A County Commissioner and Chairman of the State Central Committee. This District contains 41,622 acres and the assessment is \$2,863,900.

Second District—A County Commissioner, member of the State Central Committee, Judge of Orphans' Court. This district contains 39,622 acres and is assessed for \$2,867,875.

Third District—State Senator and member of State Central Committee. Contains 28,014 acres and is assessed for \$2,169,995.

Fourth District—Sheriff, State's Attorney, Treasurer and Judge of Orphans' Court. Contains 4,907 acres and is assessed for \$2,645,686. A large portion of this assessment is personal property owned in Chestertown.

Fifth District—Clerk of the Court, County Commissioner and member of the Legislature. Contains 18,413 acres and is assessed for \$1,949,000.

Sixth District—Register of Wills and Judge Orphans' Court. Contains 22,799 acres and assessed for \$1,482,675.

Seventh District—Member of Legislature. Contains 19,367 acres and is assessed for \$1,353,520.

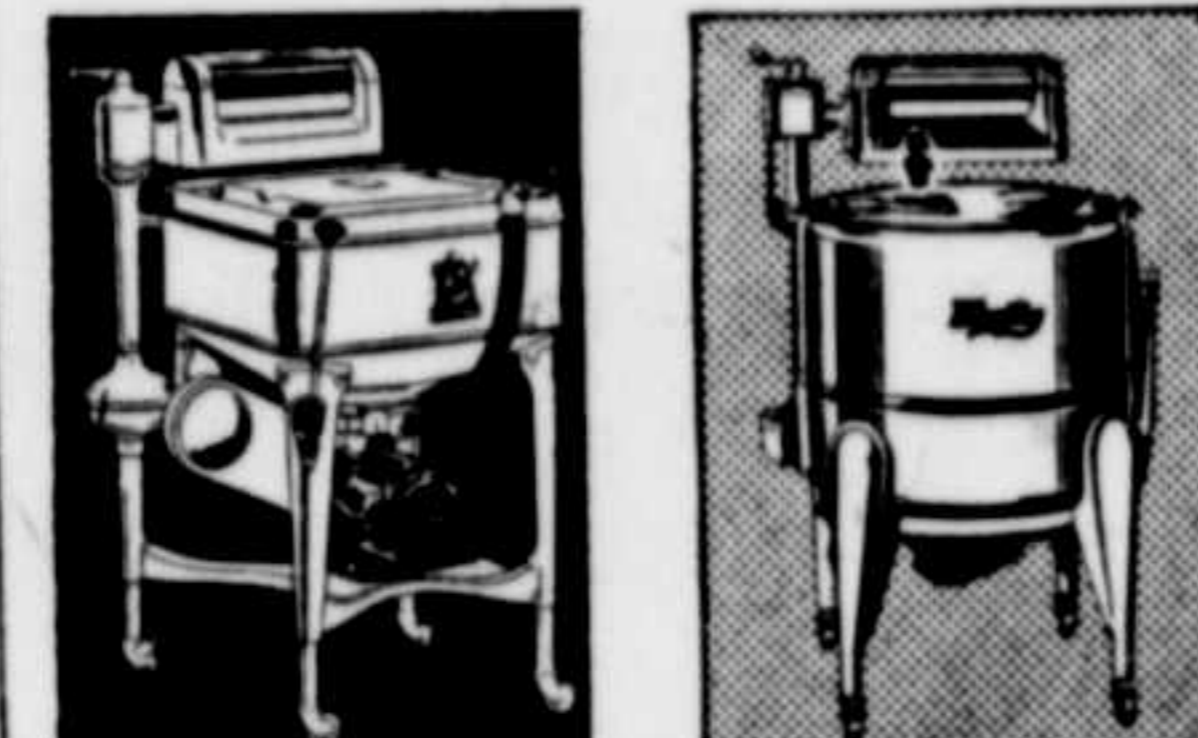
