
## Surprise Birthday Party For Ollie Herzberg

is apt to get a little tired of canned vegetables that have been just opened and heated. A few minutes time will remedy this though, for example.

**CANNED PEAS**

1 No. 2 can peas  
3 tablespoons oil  
2 tablespoons minced onions  
1 heart of lettuce, shredded  
1 teaspoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt

Combine ingredients and cook gently, stirring occasionally until most of the liquid has evaporated. Serves six.

**HARVARD BEETS**

1 No. 2 can of small, whole or diced beets, drained  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons oil  
1/2 tablespoon cornstarch  
1/4 cup water  
1/4 cup vinegar

Mix sugar and cornstarch. Add vinegar, oil and water and boil for 5 minutes. Add beets and let stand over low heat for 20 minutes.
