## A BIT OF COLONIAL HISTORY

Kent County, made a province of Maryland in 1642, grew out of a settlement founded as early as 1630 by William Claiborne.

Chestertown, originally called New Town, was laid out by authority of an act of Maryland in 1706. Its charter was revised in 1732 and the name Chester Town given to it.

A colonial port of entry. In 1756, during the French and Indian War, a number of Chestertown gentlemen fitted out a ship called the Sharpe, manned by two hundred men, carrying twenty-six guns and twenty swivels. It did valiant service against the French. On May 13, 1774, her citizens staged a tea party. When the brigantine Geddes arrived from England with a small lot of dutiable tea an indignation meeting was held and the tea thrown overboard.

Chestertown was the one town in Maryland to send several vessels loaded with provisions to the distressed patriots of Boston and Charlestown, Massachusetts.

Private capital aided by the government of Maryland conducted a large armory in Chestertown during the Revolutionary War.

Friends coming from the north will feel repaid if they visit old Shrewsbury Church, near the concrete road close to Kennedyville. The graveyard nearby is the oldest in Kent County. This parish was established in 1692, a Church built shortly afterward. A second Church was built on this site in 1729. The present structure dates from 1832.

Friends who come by way of Tolchester may like to visit St. Paul's Church which is close to the concrete road leading to Chestertown. Built in 1713, the oldest building in the state used continuously as a place of worship. The Vestry Hall (1766) is one of two original Vestry Halls in Maryland. There are none in Virginia.
