

ON THE SCREEN AT THE NEW LYCEUM

AGRICULTURE AND THE PART IT PLAYS IN NATIONAL DEFENSE

National AAA Conference Considers The 1942 Program

Measures which will assure full farm support of the Nation's defense program, encourage greater conservation, and give greater assistance to the small farmer were recommended for the 1942 farm program by a conference of representatives of the AAA Extension Service, and Vocational Agriculture from all parts of the country. These recommendations were made as the basis for formulating the specific provisions of the 1942 program to be announced later.

The conference adopted a number of resolutions relating to defense, among which it urged farmers to avoid speculative expansion and to reduce debts and build up reserves of cash and farm commodities during the present period of industrial activity and more favorable prices. It also urges that, due to shortage of farm labor in some areas, priority be given to farm machinery, and that a balance be maintained between farm and industrial prices. The need for better national nutrition was also emphasized as a defense aid.

Among the important recommendations approved by the conference were a change in the method of computing farm payments, which would eliminate the payment made on general crops such as oats, barley and rye, and would make funds formerly used for that purpose available for carrying out additional soil conservation work. However, farmers would still receive acreage allotments on surplus crops as wheat, cotton and tobacco and earn payments for planting within their allotments as at present.

Maryland was represented at this national conference by members of the state and county AAA committees

and officials of that agency in this State, and by Dr. T. B. Symons director, and Paul E. Uystrom, county agent leader, of the extension service.

Rice Croquettes

2 1/2 cups cooked rice
1 cup grated American cheese
1/2 cup butter or other shortening
1/2 cup chopped pimento
1 tablespoon chopped onion
1/2 teaspoon salt and paprika
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 egg, well beaten
1/2 cup buttered bread crumbs
Mix all well and shape into balls and fry in hot fat until brown.

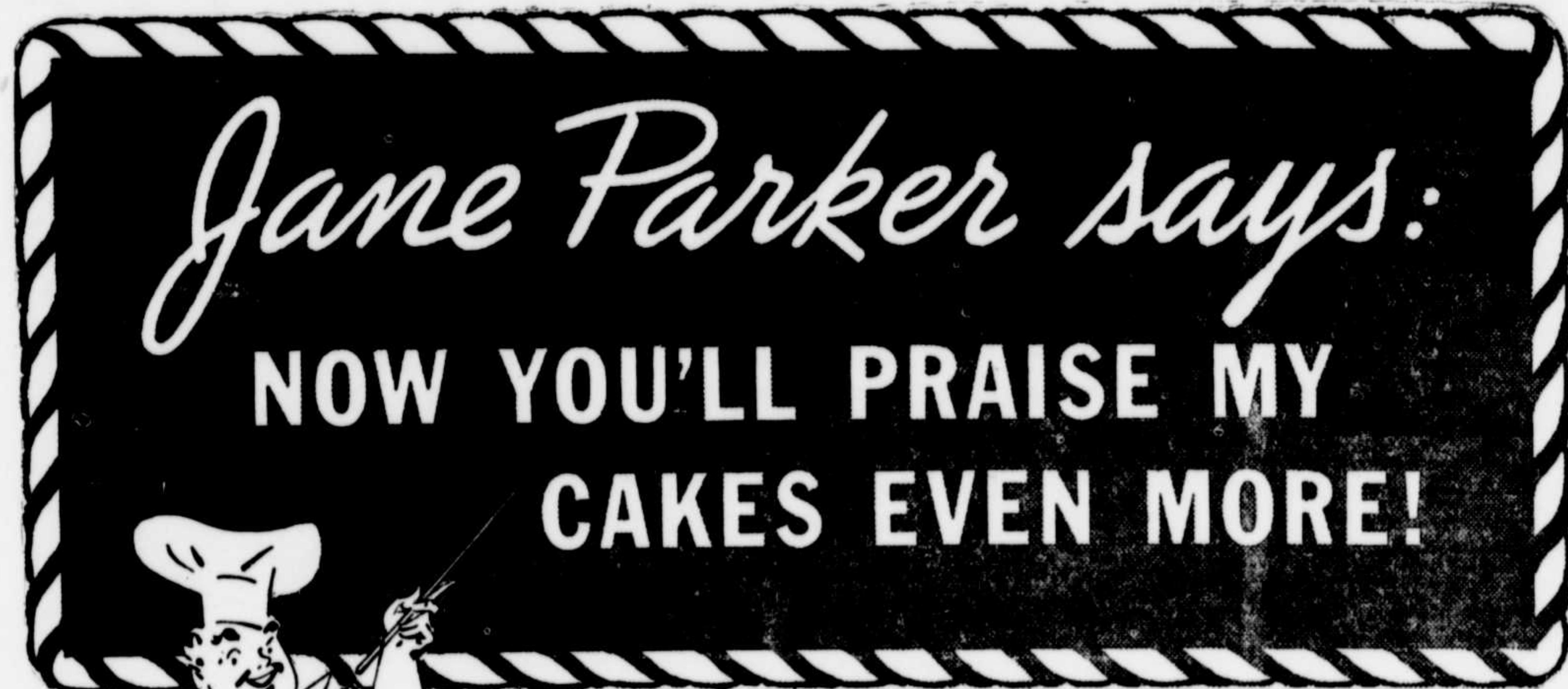
One Delicious Dessert With Coffee Flavor

As fond as most people are of coffee it is surprising to note how few use that grand flavoring in desserts, particularly when making ice cream. But aside from that there are many, many, very fine desserts to be made using coffee for example a

1-3 cup quick cooking tapioca
1/2 cup sugar
1/4 teaspoon salt
1-3 cup raisins (seedless)
1 1/2 cups boiling water
1 cup strong coffee
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup cream, whipped
Add dry ingredients and raisins to water; bring to brisk boil, stirring constantly. Place over rapidly boiling water, cook five minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool slightly; add coffee and vanilla. Chill—mixture clears and thickens as it cools. Add cream. Serves six.

To mend a leaky faucet—modern plumbing has a stop-cock below each fixture. Old plumbing systems have only one shut-off and that is usually in the basement. Shut off the flow of water before beginning to work. The leaky faucet needs a new washer. With all the water shut off, unscrew the big nut at the faucet. A monkey wrench is usually necessary. Draw out the handle-screw; at the end of a worn washer, leather or rubber. Fry off the washer with a screw driver, put on the new washer, replace the stem and reset the big faucet-screw. Open the water system by opening the shut-off.
