

### DRIVERS MUST OBEY SCHOOL BUS LAW

Now that schools throughout the State have reopened, the Maryland Traffic Safety Commission directs attention to the appearance of school buses on the highways, and is impressing upon the motorists the importance of observing the School Bus Law.

"In every section of the State, for the coming ten months, the school bus, loaded with a precious cargo of youth, will make up an important part of the traffic on our highways." E. R. McShane, Executive Secretary of the Maryland Traffic Safety Commission, stated, "The problem of protecting these school children is greater now than ever before, due to the increased traffic from other sources. Therefore, it is most vital that motorists observe this law if they would avoid accident."

As a means to protect these children the law is quoted in part as follows: "The driver of a vehicle upon a highway . . . upon meeting or overtaking any school bus which has stopped on the highway for the purpose of receiving or discharging any school child or children, shall come to a full stop at least ten feet from the school bus, either in front or rear thereof, as the case may be, and such vehicle shall remain standing until the children are received or discharged and the bus has again started."

On dual highways the drivers of automobiles are required only to stop when approaching a bus from the rear. Failing to obey the restrictions of this law, involve not less than a \$5.00 fine, with a maximum fine of \$50.00.

### EMERGENCY CROP LOAN AVAILABLE

Mr. J. D. McVean has announced that the Emergency Crop and Feed Loan Office is now ready to accept applications for loans on fall grain. Loans up to \$400.00 on the basis of not to exceed \$8.00 per acre on wheat and rye and \$6.00 per acre on other grains, are available to those who are eligible for a loan. The rate of interest is 4 percent.

Field Supervisor C. R. Hare of Salisbury who is in charge of this area will be in the County Agent's Office in Chestertown on Tuesday, September 9th for the purpose of accepting applications. In the event that the farmer is interested and it is not convenient for him to be in the office at that time, Mr. McVean said a letter could be written directly to the Emergency Crop Loan Office, Room 216 Post Office Building, Salisbury, Md., and arrangements would be made to meet such farmers in the county at a later date.

In talking over the policy of the Emergency Crop Loan Office, Mr. Hare said that it is the policy of his office to cooperate closely with the

and to encourage the planting of disease-free seed. He further stated that his office was anxious to cooperate with the farmer, whose crops were seriously damaged by drought, in the rearrangement of seeding plans for hay and pastures.

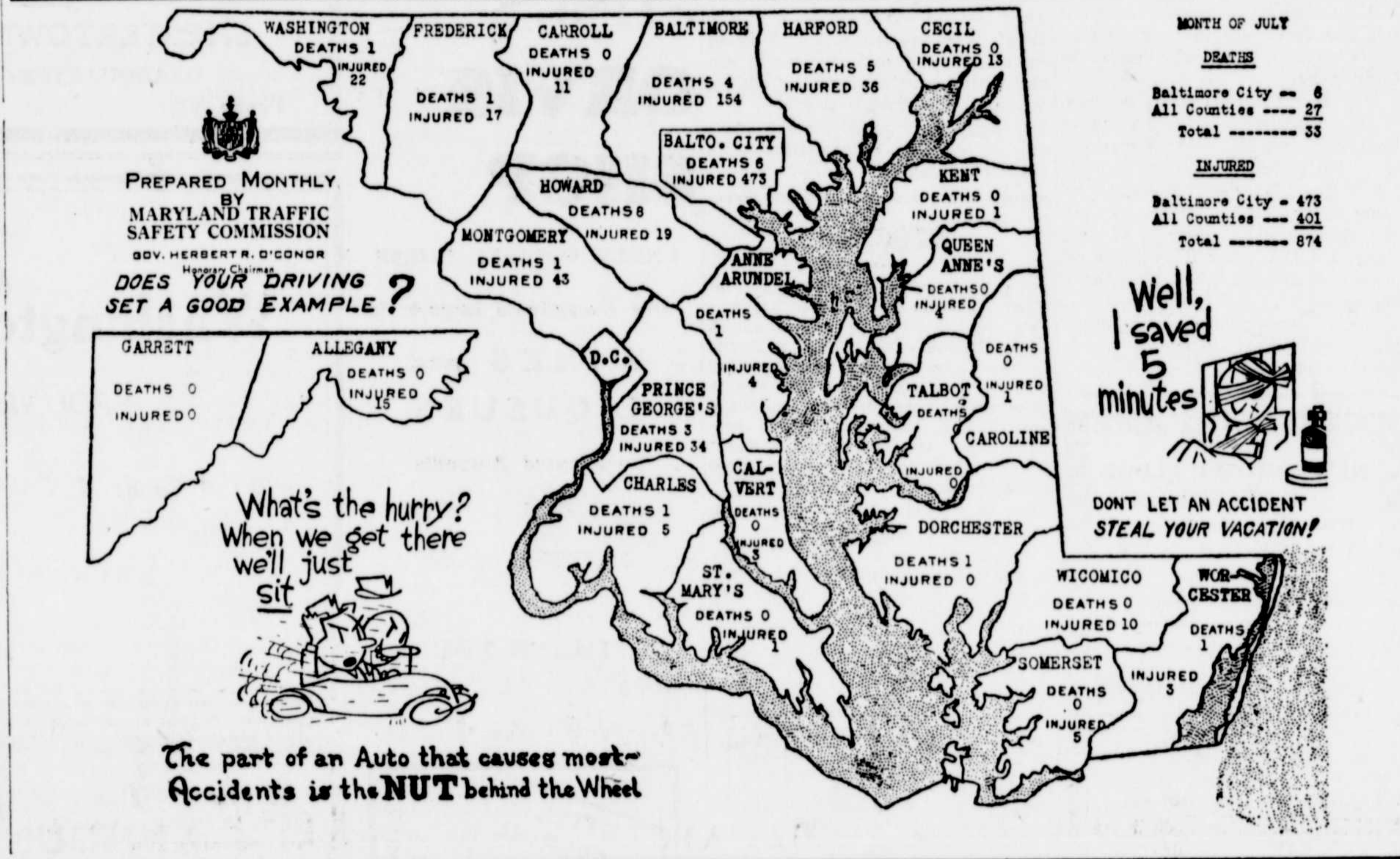
