Today concludes fire prevention week and if it is true that a serious fire is the best reminder of fire prevention, the program in Chestertown was complete. Local firemen have answered an unusual number of calls during the week and the calls were all for fires that might have resulted in serious loss.

Seven aircraft spotting stations have been operating in Kent County this week and will continue for four days next week. The work of this all defense effort has fallen on the shoulders of a comparatively few people.

While it is hard to conceive of drastic reductions in any form of taxation at this time of tremendous public expense, the fact remains that the State Tax has been reduced eight cents and another slash is due next year.

The Department of Justice announced the OCD and FBI have completed plans for "FBI Civilian Defense Courses" in 55 U. S. cities and territories where FBI field headquarters offices are located.

NEWS GATHERED ON PENINSULA

Maryland oysters are facing new competition, not from Japan as in the past, but from Mexico, it was learned this week. The matter was brought to the attention of Senator Radcliffe by Carl C. Greene of Crisfield, in a letter written from Houston, Tex., in which he said a fisheries concern at Brownsville is importing shucked oysters from Mexico and distributing them over a large part of the State.

Two new branch bacteriological laboratories were opened in September, one at La Plata in Charles County, the other at Easton in Talbot County. This brings the number of such branches to ten and enhances local facilities for assistance in the diagnosis and control of disease.

Plans to form a union to bargain for higher wages are being discussed by oyster shuckers with American Federation of Labor representatives. The shuckers said they want a minimum pay of 35 cents a gallon for opening oysters this season because their living costs have risen.

been paying 30 cents this fall. Property owners in Maryland will enjoy, during the years 1942 and 1943, the lowest State tax rate since 1861, as a result of reduction announced for these two years by Governor Herbert R. O'Connor.

For 1942, the 22-cent rate set by Act of the last Legislature, will be reduced to 14 cents, and the 20.75-cent rate established for 1943, will be reduced to 12.75 cents. Of the last 100 years only six, from 1856 to 1861, have enjoyed as low, or a lower rate than will be in effect these two years.

That the recent planting of sponge crabs in Somerset County water is producing results is the firm opinion of watermen and others from Smith's Island, and they base this opinion on the great quantity of tiny crabs which have made their appearance around Smith's Island recently.

During the first eight months this year, Government reports show that a half million more tons of cargo were carried through the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal than during the corresponding period of last year. In the first eight months of this year 2,719,740 tons were carried through the canal as against 2,215,269 tons for the same period last year.

Total number of transits of vessels through the canal in the first eight months of this year was 4,847 and in the eight-month period of last year 4,512.
