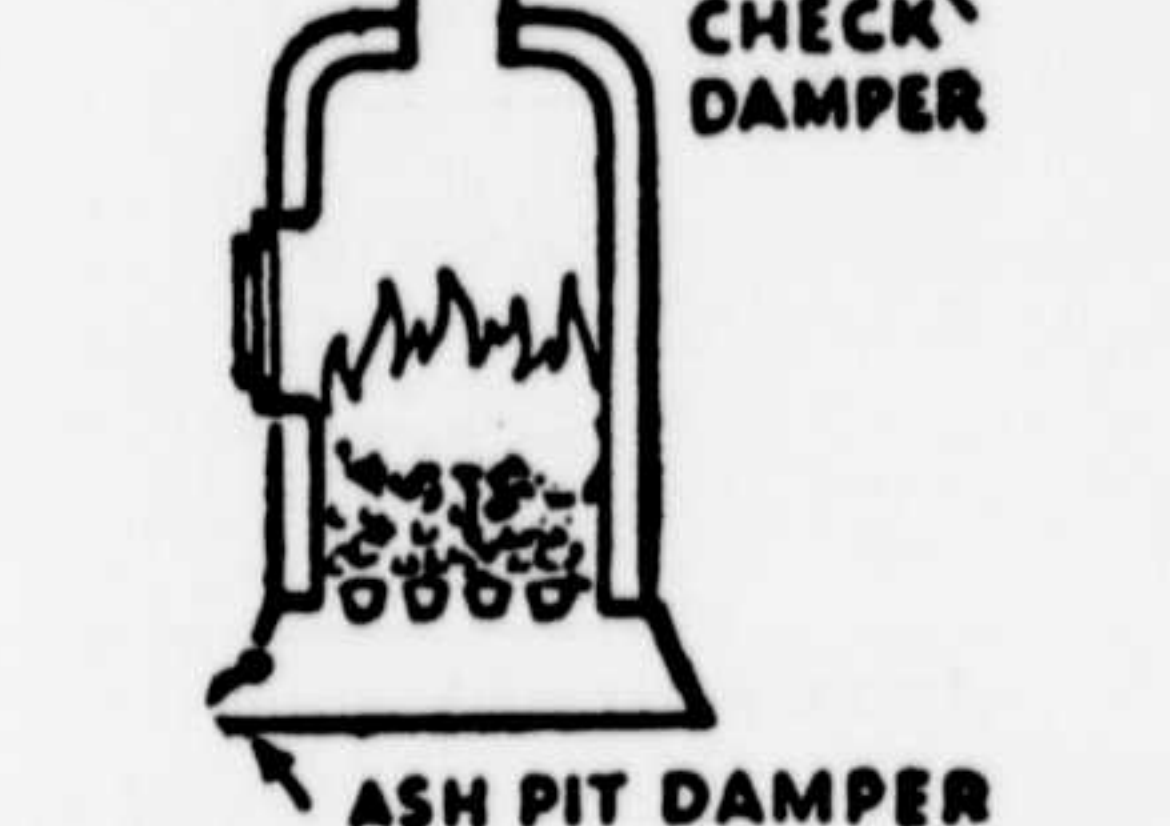


### Home Heating Hints

Let Ashpit Damper Regulate Daily Speed At Which You Want Fire To Burn.

IMPROPER adjustment of the turn (or smoke pipe) damper in your furnace results in "chimney" loss of heat. Leave this damper closed as nearly as possible without retarding free burning of fuel or causing gas to escape into the basement.

### RED SNAPPER IS GREAT DELICACY

Expert Tells How to Cook and Serve This Fish.

By EDITH M. BARBER "IS STEAK fish the same as red snapper?" asks a reader. "And how should it be cooked?" I have heard almost every fish which is large enough to be cut into steaks called by this name.

In New Orleans the snapper is called "king of the fish market." Spices are usually used in its preparation. They are put into the water when the fish is "poached" or a cut, the shape of a letter S, is made on the back and then this is stuffed with thyme, cloves and bayleaf.

### Creole Sauce.

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
1 chopped onion
1 tablespoon flour
2 cups tomatoes
1/2 cup chopped mushrooms
Thyme
Bayleaf
Cloves
Cayenne pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
Heat the olive oil and brown the onion in it. Stir in the flour and let brown slightly. Stir in the other ingredients and let simmer half an hour.

### Baked Stuffed Fish.

- 1 three-pound fish
3 cups soft bread crumbs
1 teaspoon salt
Pepper
4 tablespoons melted butter
2 tablespoons lemon juice
3 small tomatoes
6 onion rings
Salt, pepper
Split and clean fish. Mix crumbs and seasoning, add 2 tablespoons of melted butter and lemon juice. Mix well and stuff fish with mixture. Sew split edges together and place fish on oven-proof platter. Halve tomatoes, place around fish, sprinkle with salt and pepper and arrange an onion ring on each half. Pour remaining butter over fish and tomatoes. Bake in a hot oven (450 degrees Fahrenheit) about fifteen minutes until fish is tender.

### Red Dressing.

- 1/2 cup vinegar
1/2 cup olive oil
1/2 cup catsup
1 1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon paprika
1 hard-cooked egg (chopped)
1 green pepper
1 tablespoon chopped chives or onion-tops
Mix the ingredients, add a small piece of ice and beat one minute until thick.

### OTHERS WORTH TRYING

- Potato Dumplings.
2 medium boiled potatoes
2 eggs
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 cup butter
Mash potatoes, add eggs, salt, flour and seasonings and mix well. Knead lightly until smooth. Shape into one long thick roll, cut into pieces one-half to one and a half inches and roll into dumplings the length of a finger. Cook in boiling salted water ten minutes. Drain, pour melted butter over them so they will not stick.

### Raisins and Nut Pie.

- 1 cup sugar
1 tablespoon butter
2 eggs
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon cloves
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1 tablespoon vinegar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup seeded raisins
1/2 cup chopped nuts
Cream the sugar and butter and add the beaten egg yolks. Stir in the spices, vinegar, salt, raisins and nuts and fold in the beaten egg whites. Pour into a pie plate lined with pastry and bake at 450 degrees for ten minutes, then at 350 degrees for about 25 minutes longer.

### Cranberry-Orange Relish.

- 4 cups cranberries
1 1/2 oranges
2 cups sugar
Put cranberries through meat grinder. Pare oranges with sharp knife, remove seeds and trim off white membrane. Put rind and pulp through grinder and mix with sugar and berries. Let stand a few minutes before serving. For future use, pour into clean, hot jars and seal.

### Treat Knots in Wood.

One way to guard against knots and sappy places in wood when painting is to coat these with orange shellac before applying the paint. It keeps the resin or pitch from discoloring the paint.

### Repairing Concrete Roofs.

In repairing a concrete roof, the first step is to sweep and wash the surface clean. After the roof is thoroughly dry, patch and repair any breaks with plastic roof cement. Then apply a coat of primer and let it stand for a day. After this, apply a coat of liquid roof coating.

SOMETIMES we get awfully wrought up over the fact that everybody can't have a palace in town and a castle in the country. On second thought, maybe the simple life of the lady with a plain everyday house does have its points.

When we see how very attractive rooms in average homes can be, we're quite content to preserve the status quo. Below are the recipes for some of the smartly small rooms we've seen lately and liked.

These rooms were successful first because the furniture was scaled to the size of the room and because the colorings were tranquil.

With Gray-Green Walls—Eighteenth century living-room furniture with gray-green walls; light taupe carpet; sofa and chair in chintz with a plum ground and pattern in greens and white; draperies of a rough diagonal weave in gray.

Silver and White Stripes—A bedroom with mahogany furniture, a light neutral taupe rug; brilliant red satin draperies; a red satin slipper chair; side chair and bench in gray, red and white ombre striped covering; an easy chair with a floral covering in gray, rose and green on white; a white candlewick spread; accessories in crystal and white porcelain.

Dusty Plum Walls—Deep toned walls for a small living room with a carpet in the same dusty plum shade; Eighteenth century mahogany furniture; draperies in a dusty rose taffeta with wide ruffles all around; a pair of arm chairs in chintz with a dull olive green ground and a shell design in gray.

A Regency Mahogany—A dining room in Regency mahogany; deep dervy blue-green walls; rug in the same tone; draperies in a blue-green over white; white woodwork with door trim in blue-green; yellow striped damask chair seats.

"My young daughter thinks she's a sophisticate and will have no traffic with anything but modern, so her closet is papered in a very contemporary design in white and silver and her boxes are all papered in brilliant red paper with tiny silver motifs."

"For my little boy, who is at the collecting age, I've used a wall paper with a tattoo design, quite frisky and jolly looking. I painted shelves and inside of door in bright blue and dispensed with boxes for him for the simple reason that I knew he'd never use them—yet."

### GET READY FOR WINTER DRIVING

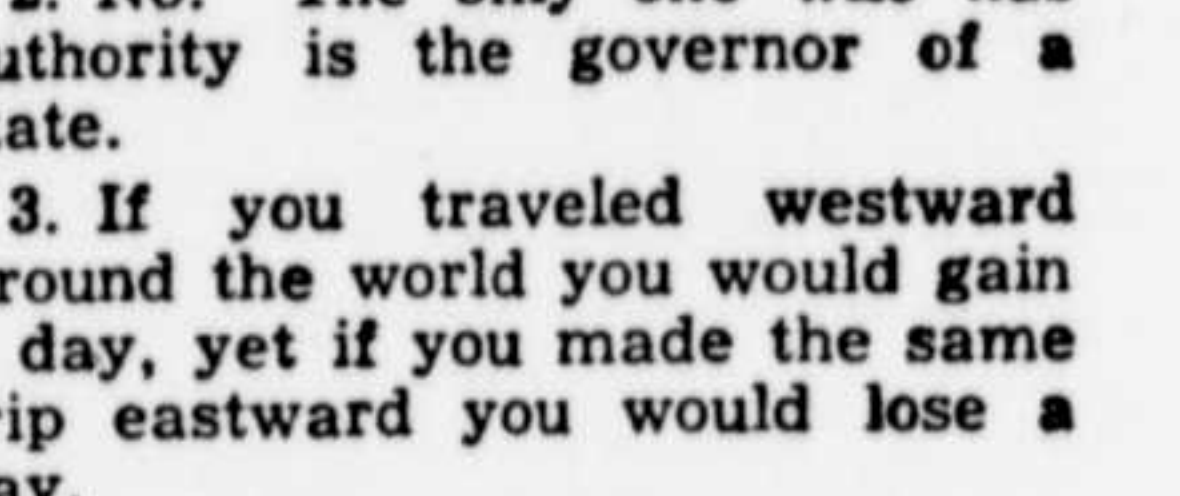
