Beautiful Lanahan Estate Purchased By Sisters of Mercy For Convalescent Home.

Immediately to the new sanatorium. Applications for admission to the hospital have been numerous in the last few months and many patients had to be turned away because of lack of accommodations. With the addition of the Lanahan estate the hospital will now be in a position to admit many more patients because of the removal of the convalescents to the new adjunct.

The property was purchased from the Lanahan estate through Judge N. Charles Burke, of Towson, the executor. It was said that the cost was \$100,000. The estate, which is one of the most beautiful in the State, is enhanced by the fact that a large man-chouse, conservatory, barns, garages and other outbuildings are upon the site. The building is surrounded with groves and the estate comprises 48½ acres. The property has a frontage of 494 feet on Charles street avenue, 1,643 feet on Bellona avenue and 900 feet on Gittings avenue.

Sister Constance was highly elated over the acquisition of the new sanatorium. She said that "Every bed in our hospital has been occupied in the last few months. As soon as one patient would get well there was another to be admitted and the congestion has had me worried. We will now send our convalescents to Mercy Villa Sanatorium and this will enable us to take care of more patients who are in urgent need of medical attention or who have to undergo operations."
