Miss Viola Foster, of Baltimore, has returned after visiting her mother, Mrs. George Foster.

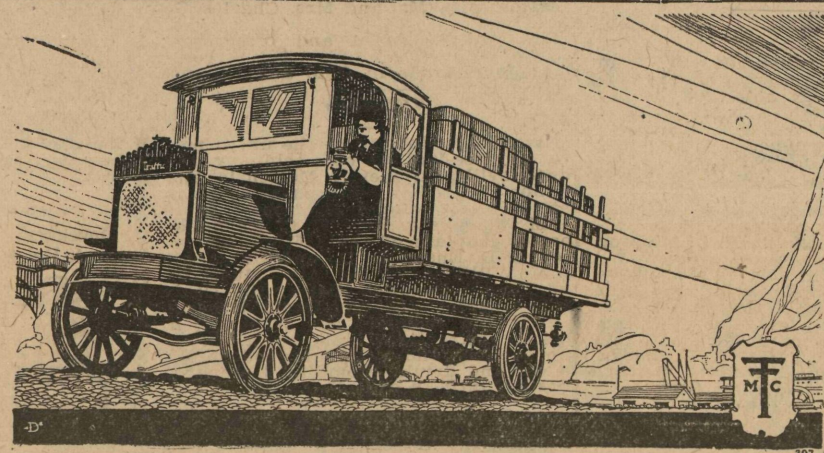

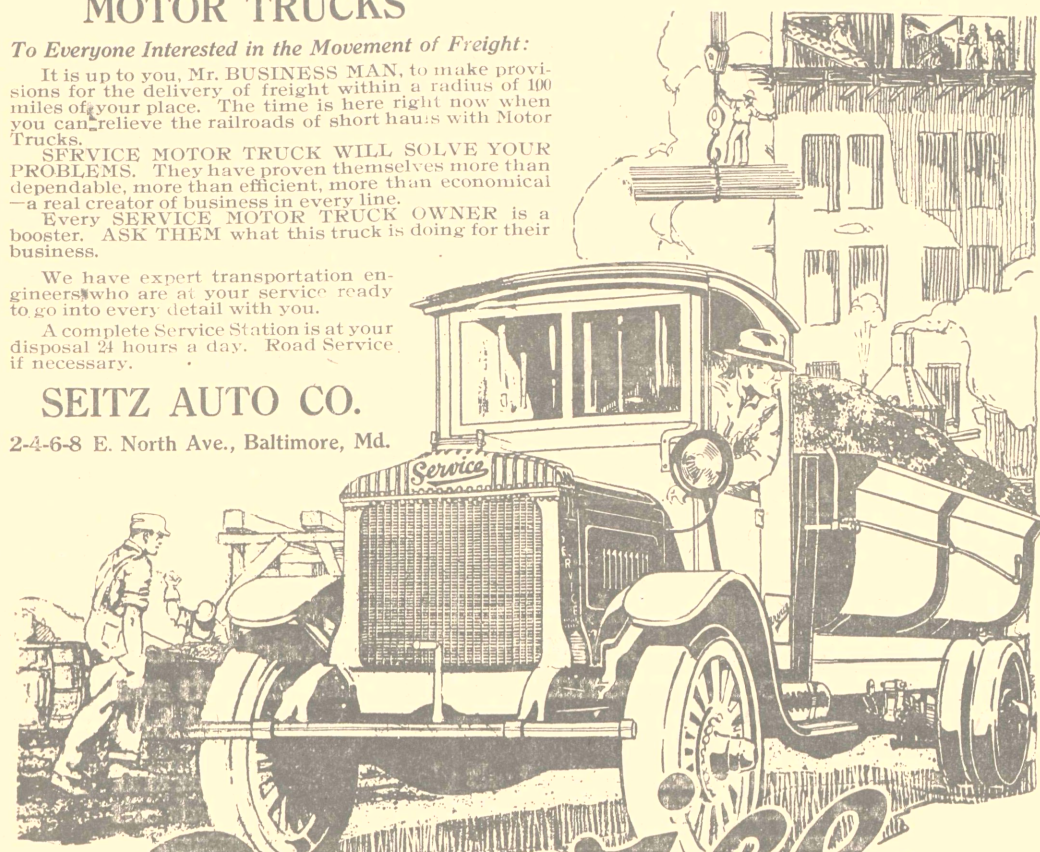
