



Ammonia by New Process.

An enterprising American has secured from the Italian government a concession for the utilization of 800 horsepower of the Marmore cascades near Terni, about seventy miles from Rome, and maintains that he can turn out nitrogenous plant food for the Italian farmer at a cost as low as 1 lira per kilo (equivalent to \$0.088 per pound, with the lira taken at its par exchange value of \$0.193). It is said that the falls are capable of generate ing not less than 150,000 persepower




