WHITE HALL.

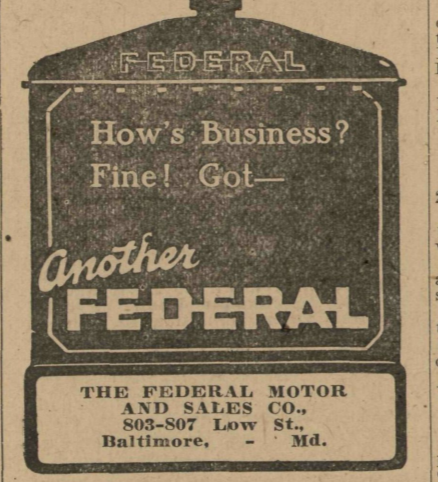

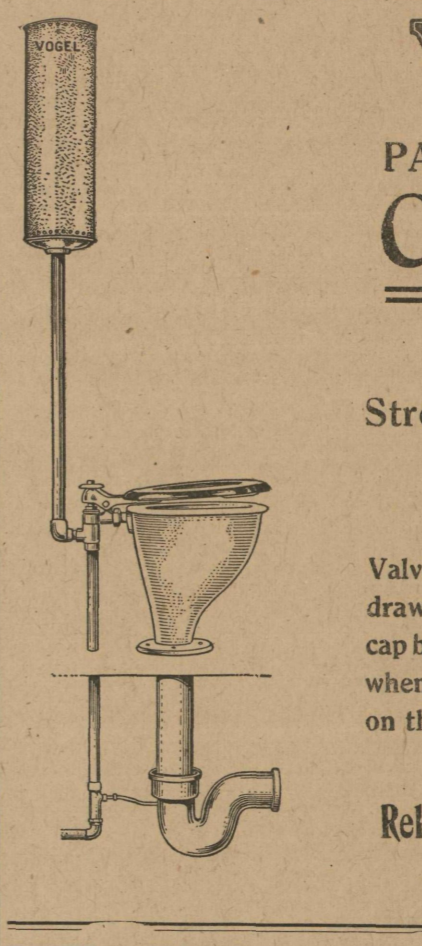
