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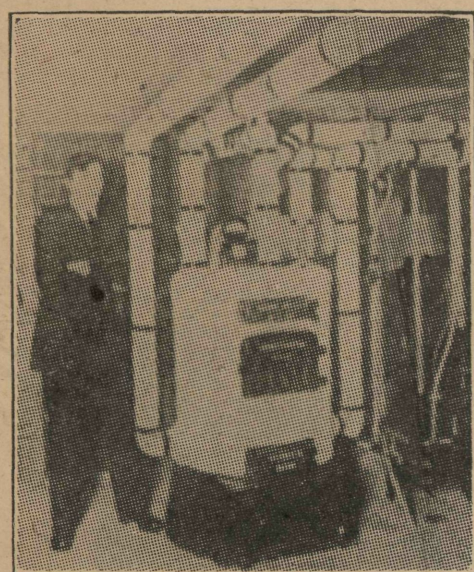

Affected.

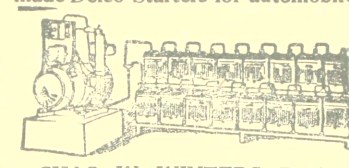

skilled physician in times of sickness, and are allowed to do pretty much as they please.

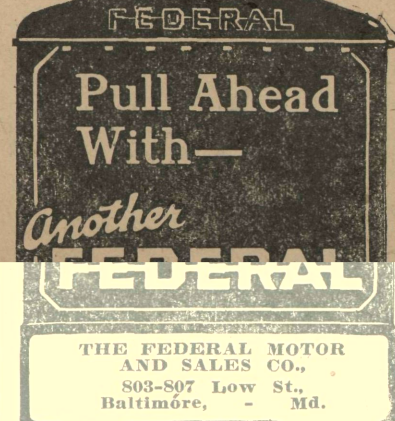
A representative of The Jeffersonian recently went through the almshouse and interviewed some of the inmates. Everyone seemed satisfied and contented. No dissatisfaction of any kind was evident. The rooms were warm and comfortable, the inmates were clean and apparently well fed, and the general surroundings were homelike. In fact, several of the inmates asserted that they could not wish for a better home.

A number of public-spirited ladies in the county have in recent years taken an active interest in the welfare of the almshouse, and their ideas were largely adopted by the County Commissioners in the improvements recently made. A committee, representing these ladies, makes periodical visits to the almshouse and they have found nothing in the way the home is conducted to warrant criticism.

How anyone could conceive the idea that women of the inmates whom the rats do not eat will die of starvation is inconceivable. Let the writer of this communication come out in the open, give his or her full name and address, and the name of the supposed physician quoted in the communication, so that the people of the county may know the truth. If the conditions at the almshouse are anything like as bad as pictured, the officials and the people of the county want to know it, so that steps may be taken at once to remedy the situation. If the conditions are not as pictured, they want this unjust aspersion upon the institution retracted.

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This is money which is brought into Towson from outside, not merely the circulation of money that is already here.

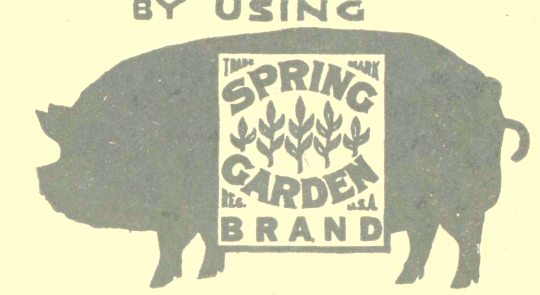
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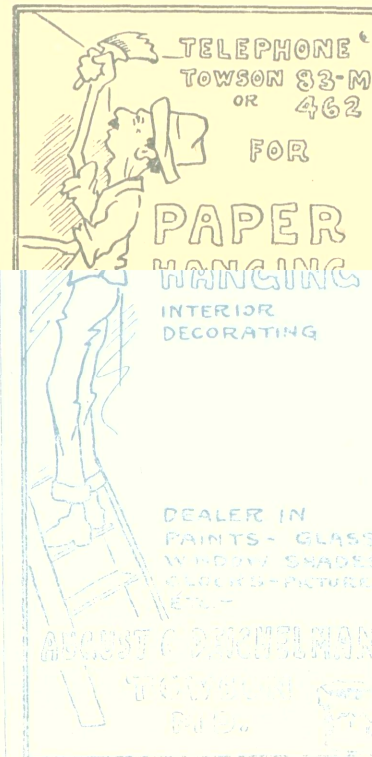
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
