JACKET FROCK

Right: Pattern H-3116. This sophisticated little affair is the number one entry in the 1936 fashion parade. Designed primarily for youthful figures and those who can wear smaller sizes, the style emphasis is in the snugly-fitted, cutaway jacket with two rows of silver buttons to accent the double-breasted jacket. Patterns available in sizes 12, 14, 16, 18 and 20. Corresponding bust measurements 30, 32, 34, 36 and 38. Size 14 (32) requires 2 1/2 yards of 54-inch fabric plus 1/4 yard of the 39-inch contrast for collar and cuffs.

BETWEEN-SEASON BLOUSE

Left: Pattern H-3114. Elissa Landi, Paramount star, features the smart neck treatment of this clever blouse. The collar can be worn high or low. Sleeves have a deep pointed cuff. Patterns available in sizes 12, 14, 16, 18 and 20. Corresponding bust measurements 30, 32, 34, 36 and 38. Size 14 requires 2 1/2 yards of 35 or 39-inch fabric.



Scald the milk, add the sugar, salt and fat and allow to cool until lukewarm. Add yeast dissolved in lukewarm water and about one-half of flour. Beat the egg well and add to mixture. Add enough flour to make as soft a dough as can be handled. Place in a well greased bowl, cover and set in warm place until the dough has doubled in bulk. Shape rolls and place on a greased pan. Set in a warm place, allow to rise until light and bake.

Among the interesting recipes timely for this season are:

Hot Cross Buns

Add one cup of seedless raisins or one-half cup currants to the recipe for sweet foundation dough. When dough is light, shape buns about the size of a large egg. Brush with melted butter and place close together on a baking sheet or 2 inches apart if individual buns are desired. Set in a warm place and allow to rise until light. Cut a cross on the top of each bun with a sharp knife. Bake in a hot oven (375 to 400 degrees F.). Just before removing from the oven brush cross with powdered sugar icing.



TWO-PIECE FROCK

It features a high neckline with self fabric tab tie, the front panel running the length of the blouse and the skirt — the pattern is easy to follow. Polka-dots are smarter than ever for the coming season. Patterns available in sizes 12, 14, 16, 18 and 20. Corresponding bust measurements 30, 32, 34, 36 and 38. Size 14 requires 4 yards of 35 or 39-inch fabric.



EASY TO MAKE

Pattern H-3128. The simple lines of this youthful shirt-waist frock make it easy for your own hands to impart the hand-tailored look that fashion dictates this season. The model shows a light-weight wool jersey with inverted pleats at the center front and back which give extra fullness to the skirt. Long or short sleeves as you prefer. Patterns available in sizes 12, 14, 16, 18 and 20. Corresponding bust measurements 30, 32, 34, 36 and 38. Size 14 requires 2 1/2 yards of 54-inch fabric plus 1/4 yard of 39-inch contrast.
