Several churches and other groups were represented for the first time. It was announced that the group represents well nigh three thousand individuals from southern Lancaster county, Pa., and nearby Chester county and Cecil county, Md.

A resolution favoring National Mandatory Neutrality Legislation was passed and has been sent to the Senators from Pennsylvania and Maryland, and the Representatives of Lancaster and Chester county, Pa. district, and Cecil county, Md.

National Peace Legislation was discussed and a poster committee and a public meeting committee were appointed. The next meeting of the committee will be held February 11, 1937, at the Little Britain High School at 8:00 p. m.
