

Suspicion may be granted, but
the Justice ought to very carefully
there is good cause for suspicion,
just ground left of malicious. A
general warrant to apprehend
all suspected Person, is not good.

The warrant may be directed
to the Sheriff bailiff constable or
to any indifferent Person by Name
who is no Officer, for the Justice
may authorize any one in his Offi-
ce, yet it is most advisable
to direct it to the constable of
the precinct wherein it is to be
executed for that no other cons-
table and fortiori no private per-
son, is compellable to serve it.

Every warrant ought to con-
tain the special Matter for

which the warrant is granted.
