ORCHARDS .- A correspondent of the "Northwestern Farmer" furnishes that Sec. 2. And be it enacted, that this paper some excellent suggestions for the successful planting and management of orchards, of which the following is a brief summary:

1. Be careful to plant on the higher and dried portions of the farm, and avoid low and wet places.

2. Ascertain the experience of other planters in that region as to the best, most reliable and hardy varieties, and plant no other except for limited trial. This information may be obtained from books and periodicals. For want of it, many trees have perished or borne but

3. Give orchards good cultivation, either with no crops at all between the trees or with such crops as potatoes, beans and cabbage, that require of the cultivator. 4. Shelter from severe cutting winds, either by planting at a moderate dis-
