The hon. David Montague Brskine, envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary of his Britannic majesty, to the U. States, arrived in Philadelphia on Monday last, from Washington, with his lady and family.

Col. Aaron Burr, arrived at Philadelphia, on Sunday last.

Governor Patten, of the Island of St. Helena, has been suspended by the British government, for having weakened the garrison of that place, by sending a part of the troops to Buenos Ayres.

The ship Eliza, of New-Bedford, from Cadiz, for N. Orleans, has been carried into Mantanzas by her passengers who rose upon the master and crew.

The ship Tom, of Portsmouth, quarter boards washed away and apparently every thing off the decks, was seen 30th March, at sea; being strong gales and high sea could not be spoken with.

Markets at Marseilles 23d Feb. fish 4 50; several cargoes unsold. Much the same price at Genoa, Alicante, and Leghorn.

April 11, lat. 35, long. 57, spoke Hope, from Baltimore for Plymouth.

An arrival at Philadelphia, from Nevis, states, April 18, lat. 22, 30, long. 66, 30, spoke ship Ceres, from Greenock, bound to Savannah. Captains Medcalf & Smith, who were taken into Nevis, were going up to Antigua for trial.

From the Berkshire Reporter.

The following is extracted from a letter written by Henry Inge-soll, (son of Mr. Jonathan Ingersoll, of Stockbridge), to his brother-in-law, the late Thomas Allen, esq. of this town, dated at "Cathagenia, October 26, 1807," received from New-York.

"Dear Brother,

"I embrace a very uncertain opportunity of informing my friends of my unhappy situation. I left New-York under promising circumstances, in good spirits, and with an idea of soon returning to enjoy with my friends the reward of prudence and industry. But alas! vain hope! behold me now, doomed to groan in a foreign country, under the galling chains of slavery, for a term of TEN years, deprived of liberty, and all I hold dear in life.

"I shall give you a particular account of the expedition in which I was engaged, as well as what happened to myself. Francis de Miranda, (born in this country), with the assistance of a few friends in the U. States, fitted out the Leander, capt. Lewis, with the intention of revolutionizing some of the Spanish provinces in South-America. Col. Smith, of New-York, was Miranda's principal agent in engaging men to go on the expedition, who kept the destination of it a secret, but assured them it was fair and honorable, and likewise authorised by the United States. There was a company of dragoons engaged, under the idea of guarding the mail from the city of Washington to N. Orleans. A number of officers engaged, who were to take command of their respective companies, &c. at their destined port. Four printers, besides myself, were likewise engaged. The whole amounted to about two hundred.

"We sailed from New York the 2d Feb. 1806, in the Leander, of 16 guns, and arrived at Jacmel the 17th, where we lay until the 27th March, during which time 2 schooners were chartered for the expedition, viz. the Bee and Bacchus; the former of which I was put on board, together with 2 of my fellow printers, as well as 16 of the dragoons and 4 officers. On board the Bacchus the other 2 printers, besides a number of officers and men, were ordered. The reason of this was, to make room on board the ship for a number of officers, who came from Port-au-Prince—among whom was George W. Kirkland, who came in the capacity of colonel of infantry. During the time we remained in Jacmel, I grew very suspicious of the designs of Miranda, and wished to leave him and his expedition, and return to America; but was not allowed to.

"We sailed from Jacmel the 27th of March. Nothing material occurred until the 27th of April, when we arrived off Cavello, on the Spanish Main, where it was intended to make a landing near that place; but two guarda costers appearing in sight, we stood on for them till near night, when not being able to find out their force, we stood off from land that night; the next day we came to an action, when the schooners Bee and Bacchus were taken. Captain Hud-dle, of the Bee, was killed. The Leander cowardly deserted us, and made her escape. We were taken into Porto-Cavello, there put in irons and confined in a most loathsome prison, with scarce sufficient air to breathe. In a few weeks our trial took place; the result of which was that FRANK was condemned to be hanged and beheaded at Porto-Cavello, viz. Miles L. Hall, late of Lenox, Francis Farquharson, Charles Burgard, Thomas Billopp, Daniel D. Kemper, James B. Gardner, Thomas Donahue, and Paul T. George. Their sentence was dated the 12th July, and read to them the 20th, in the presence of all the prisoners. At the same time 15 were condemned to ten years slavery in the Castle of Omoa, among whom I am classed—thirteen for the same term at Boca Chica, and nineteen for eight years at Boca Chica. Shortly after our trial we were ordered from Porto-Cavello to Cathagenia, where we now remain, waiting an opportunity to be sent to our respective places.

"Such has been the fate of Miranda's expedition, as far as I know, which I think could not have sailed from New-York without the knowledge of the government of the United States. If however, it did sail without her knowledge, I am convinced that if she knew of the manner in which her citizens were deluded from New-York by colonel Smith, John Fin, and others, she would intercede for their liberty, and punish those who fitted out a vessel in one of her ports, with the intention of committing depredations against a nation with whom she is at peace.

"Not knowing what course the government of the United States steers, I wish, if she interests herself in the affair of Miranda, you would exert yourself on the side of humanity in procuring the liberation of her unfortunate and deluded citizens, who are

now suffering in prison for Miranda and his followers."

Admiral Cochrane, with six ships of the line & four frigates, had arrived at Dominique. Three British ships from England, bound to Surinam, were captured & brought into Fort Royal, Martinique. April 17, passed a ship off Swan Point, which we took to be the Bermuda, from Batavia.
