NEW YORK, May 16.

A French Journal, printed at Rouen, in Normandy, contains the following singular paragraph: "The success of the French Revolution killed Burke, the orator; the battle of Austerlitz broke Pitt's heart; Fox died through joy on seeing himself in place."

The emperor of Russia has given a fresh instance of an enlightened mind, in an Ukase, which has recently been issued at St. Petersburg, in favor of commerce. In order to give more consideration and distinction to commercial pursuits, the Ukase recommends the establishment of commercial companies; it allows the nobility to become members of the first and second classes of merchants, it being the anxious wish of the emperor to draw closer the ties between these two descriptions of his subjects. Wholesale merchants may even aspire to the first offices of the state and are to have the privilege of appearing at court. Measures are also to be taken to preserve and perpetuate the names of the most eminent merchants, and transmit them with distinction to posterity.

On Thursday evening about half past 9 o'clock, as two young gentlemen, with two ladies, were on their way to Greenwich in a coach, they were stopped by two footpads, who darted upon them from Williamson's nursery, with each a pistol in his hand, and demanded their money.
