NEW-YORK, May 18. Arrived, ship Juliana, Grassan, 186 days from Calcutta, and 50 from St. Helena. Left at St. Helena, March 25, schr. Sabi, Groves, of Boston, for the Cape of Good Hope. The brig Tropic, Miller, sailed the day before for Boston. May 10, lat. 33, 10, long. 68, spoke ship Speculation, Swinson, of New-York, 19 days from New-Orleans, for Cherbourg.

Schooner Lively, Hamsdell, from Portorico, is below.

Capt. Fram, of the ship Caroline, from N. Orleans, for Falmouth and a market, finding his vessel too tender, put into this port to take in some more ballast.

Yesterday arrived, brig Expectation, Tarris, from Isle of France. Sailed 6th March. Left no American vessels there. A ship under American colors was going in when the brig came out. In the Expectation came the mate and 3 seamen, late belonging to the ship Myers, capt. Edes, from Boston to the South Seas and East Indies, who say the said ship ran ashore the 23d of February, 1805, on one of the Crozet Islands, lying in lat. 47, S. and long. 50, E. where the ship and cargo were lost, but the people all got on the said island, where they could not find a human inhabitant of any kind, and scarcely any wood. Here they lived on birds and fish, until they were relieved and taken off by capt. Chase in a whaling brig and carried to the Isle of France. About the same time the brig Enterprise, of New York, was also cast away at Crozet, and the people of her were relieved and brought off by the Eliza, and landed at the Isle of France.

Same day, brig Sally, Griffing, from St. Jago de Cuba. Left there, the 1st instant, schr. Indiana, Briggs, of and for Philadelphia, ready for sea; schr. Hannal, Este, for ditto, in 3 days. The schr. Huber, Weeks, sailed for Havana 2 days before the Sally. Two British schooners and two sloops, from St. Domingo, had been lately sent into St. Jago; one called the Dolphin, of and for London, was captured after a desperate engagement.

A gentleman, passenger in the ship Louisiana, now in the river, came up to town last evening, and informs us, that they left Marselles the 2d April. He has on board, if he recollects rightly, the 45th or 60th bulletin, containing advices of a fresh engagement between the Russians and the French, in which the latter claims the victory. This action is said to have taken place in the neighborhood of Konigsburg, which place was invested. As we already have accounts from Paris of the 30th March, and from Bordeaux of the 4th April, both silent as to this event, we apprehend there must be some mistake in this report. The gentleman also informs, that accounts were received at Marselles of an advantage obtained over the Russians by the Turks—So we go!

COURT OF VICE-ADMIRALTY.

Nassau, (N. P.) April 16, 1807. Before the worshipful Henry Morton Dyer, esq. sole judge and commissary.

Enterprise, Fitzgerald, master—a further proof case—Mr. Armstrong, solicitor-general, exhibited further proof in further support of the claim of Messrs. William and John Craig, of New-York, which he prayed to be admitted, and the goods to be restored as claimed.

Mr. Kerr prayed the same to be rejected and the said goods to be condemned.

His honor the judge having heard the said proofs read, and the arguments of advocates and proctors on both sides thereon, was pleased to admit the same, pronounced the said goods to have been as claimed, and by interlocutory decree, directed the same to be restored to the claimant or his representative, for the use of the owners and proprietors thereof.

Sally, Johnson, master—a further proof case—The solicitor-general exhibited a letter from Kirk and Lucens of Charleston, merchants, with an attestation annexed, wherein he prayed that further time be allowed them to produce the proofs required by the decree of the court of the 13th of January last.

Mr. Kerr objected; that the time granted had expired on the 13th instant, and numerous vessels had sailed for and arrived from Charleston, in the interval; wherefore he prayed the application for further time to be rejected, the claimants put in foreman, and the goods to be condemned.

His honor the judge having heard the said letter and attestation read, and as also the petition for condemnation, and the arguments of advocates and proctors on both sides thereon, was pleased to extend the time heretofore granted to bring in further proof until next court day.

Matched, qui tam verus the American schooner Pearl, C. Forbes, master, and 14 boxes of candles. Mr. Mathews prayed the claim by him given to be admitted, and the said ship and goods to be restored as claimed.

Mr. Wyllie, his majesty's advocate, prayed the same to be condemned.

His honor the judge having heard the said claim and proofs read, as also the examination of witnesses, taken upon special interrogatories, and the arguments of advocates and proctors on both sides thereon, pronounced that the said fourteen boxes of candles had been illegally imported in the said ship, and as such, together with the said ship, subject and liable to confiscation, and by interlocutory decree condemned the same to be forfeited for a breach of the laws of trade.

Extract of a letter from Cape-Francois, dated April 1.

"The commerce of this country is more shackled now than ever it was during the latter time of Dessalines' despotic reign. By a decree of gen. Christophe, the price of coffee, throughout his jurisdiction, is fixed at 25 sous, and it must be purchased from government only. The planters are not permitted to dispose of it to individuals. Beef, pork, wine, oil, soap, gin, with several other articles usually shipped to this country, are selling for less than cost in America. In fact, I do not see any thing short of ruin staring those in the face who are so wild as to adventure to this country in its present distracted state. The coast has been clear of privateers of late, and vessels dropping in every few days. Petition is much more favorable to commerce than the petty tyrant who commands here."
