NUISANCE.

IS it possible that health-officers can pass along Sharpes-street, without noticing that a formidable Nuisance on the west side of said street, between Conway and Barre-streets, is the portion of the people who live in that part of the city, that it is not possible for any of these gentlemen to pass along without noticing it; for it requires no spectacles, nor even natural eyes, if the nose be used, to ascertain the Nuisance alluded to—And it is further believed, that if there were such a Nuisance adjacent to the dwellings of the health-officers, it would soon be removed; for it is reasonable to suppose, that they have more feeling for themselves and families than what they have for their fellow-citizens, as they have in vain been applied to for redress.
