NEW-YORK, May 22.
Capt'n Shepherd, of the brig *Ceres*, from Guadalupe, informs that the day before he sailed a French vessel from E. gland, bound to Cape Francois, with a cargo of 800,000 dollars value, was brought into Point-Petre by a French privateer.
A passenger in the same vessel informs that a vessel arrived there from St. Thomas, the day before he sailed, with intelligence that a French squadron out of Rochefort had taken the Cape of Good Hope.
The ship *Phoenix*, Tinker, 16 days from city St. Domingo. Left brig *Neptune*, for Baltimore, in 10 days; ship *Mary*, ditto, May 14, in lat. 32, long. 71, spoke brig *Julia*, of Newburyport, from Antigua, for North-Carolina.
The brig *Nancy*, Robinson, 23 days from New-Orleans, and 90 from the Belize. At the Bar, the ship *Augusta*, of Baltimore.
The brig *Ceres*, Shepherd, 31 days from Point-Petre, (Gua.) May 2, was boarded by two men of war brigs, and treated politely.
The brig *Planter*, Denison, 13 days from St. Croix. Four days since, spoke a British frigate and sloop of war, standing out from the Capes of Virginia, under a full press of sail, steering E.
The British sloop, *Parker*, Blenwood, 32 days from Barbados, and 21 from Tortola. Sailed in company with a British homeward bound fleet of 130 sail.
The brig *Luna*, Starr, 7 days from Savannah. Spoke May 17, lat. 36, 11, long. 74, 30, brig *Mercator*, 48 days from Bordeaux for Norfolk.
The sloop *Sincerity*, Cook, 5 days from Newbern.
The Portuguese brig *Atlantico*, Cawatho, 27 days from Barbados. We learn by this vessel, that an intention had been discovered among the negroes to revolt, and 13 of the ring leaders had been shot.
The schr. *Factor*, Smith, of Middletown, from Martinique, via Nevis, 15 days (where she was sent by the Success privateer, and detained 31 days, and released, the freight being detained for further proof.) Left schr. *Friendship*, Metcalf, of New-York, condemned, except freight; Governor Carter, Churchill, from Martinique for Plymouth, waiting trial. At Antigua, 19 days since, schr. *Chesborough*, of Stonington, from Point-Petre for Charleston, vessel and part of cargo cleared; brig *Jan*, Lynch, to sail in 2 or 3 days for New-York, 60 hhd's. sugar on freight having been condemned.
The schr. *Jacob Getting*, Nichols, of Newbern, 15 days from St. Pierre, Mart.
The schr. *Aurora*, Allen, 6 days from Wilmington, N. C.
The sloop *Mars*, Bennet, 6 days from E. denton.
A ship from Lisbon for N. York, is at Riker's Island.
Cleared, schr. *Venus*, Oliver, Wilmington; sloop *Colodon*, Voglum, Baltimore.
Capt. Tinker from St. Domingo informs, that the brig *Hero*, Gardner, from Nantucket for St. Jago, was carried into Samana, the brig *Clothier*, Coffin, for Jamaica, sent into Barracoa; a Philadelphia brig for St. Jago de Cuba, also sent in. The captains were at St. Domingo waiting trial. The *Hero* was cleared in the lower court on the 2d inst.

BY THIS DAY'S MAILS.
BOSTON, May 20.
Arrived yesterday, ship *Adams*, Coffin, 27 days from Sorinam. Left, April 20, the *James*, of Norfolk. May 1, in lat. 24, long. 63, fell in with a French privateer, who, after firing several shot, boarded and robbed us of a boat, and several small articles; she had an English brig in custody, which she had taken the Sunday previous.
Entered, Good Intent, Baxter, Alexandria. MILAN, March 17.
We learn from Constantinople, that all the Russian merchantmen were seized on the 12th February; and that two frigates from Corfu, with troops, had been taken at the Dardanelles.
The strait, at the entrance of which the Dardanelles are situated, is about two miles wide, and much narrower for 20 miles. This strait is the ancient Hellespont; and the 2 castles are, one of them situated on the European side, called *Rumelia*; the other on the Asiatic shore, called *Matoch*. These were the ancient Sestos and Abidos. Gallipoli, the residence of the Grand Pacha, or high admiral of the Ottoman fleet, is situated on this strait.
COMMERCIAL.
Markets at Kingston, Jamaica, 19th ult. very dull for American produce, corn excepted, which was at 2 dollars per bushel.
St. Pierre, 17th April.
This place seems rapidly approaching a state of starvation; and there is no doubt in a few days there will be a general demand. At present every thing (except flour) is on the rise. Fish is at 12 dollars per cwt. none at market. Provisions generally getting in demand. Our road seems almost deserted; only 6 or 7 vessels in port, and nearly all ready to sail.
NEW-YORK, May 22.
ARRIVED.
The ship *Ocean*, Pinder, 24 days from Trinidad, and 90 from St. Thomas. Just before the *Ocean* sailed from Trinidad, a large ship arrived from England, with arms, &c. sufficient for 15,000 men.
The sloop *Chancellor*, Butler, 6 days from Savannah.
The brig *Eliza*, Pendleton, 30 days from Kingston, Jamaica.
The brig *Jane*, Lynch, from Martinique, and 14 days from Antigua. Left schooner *Sperry-Baker*, Leach, for New York in 3 days; brig *Eliza*, of Philadelphia, in 10; schr. *Gardner*, for Marblehead, next day. An American captured brig was just going in. Sailed in co. schooner *Industry*, *Chesborough*, of Stonington, for Charleston. The brig *Montezuma* sailed a week before for New York.
