POSTSCRIPT. Capt. Kearny, of the ship Monticello, arrived last evening in 37 days from Amsterdam—and having favored the Editors of the New-York Gazette with papers to the 8th ult. they are enabled to give a few translations, which are considerably interesting—all prospects of peace had vanished, and the land about to be again stained with the blood of thousands!

The latest accounts from the grand armies were to the 24th of April—At which time no general action had taken place, but was momentarily expected. Both the French and Russian armies had received immense reinforcements. The head quarters of the French were at Finkenstein, and those of the Russians at Bartenstein, about forty English miles distant; but their advanced corps were only 5 miles apart, and had frequent skirmishes.

All ideas of peace had vanished: An article from Vienna dated April 18, states: "It is apparent that the new campaign between the Russian and the French armies will soon be opened; the negotiations for peace are at an end. We remain neutral."

Memel, April 16. The continuation of war is already decided. Baron Hardenberg is appointed minister of foreign affairs.

Warsaw, April 16. A levy of 15000 men from this country,

has been ordered to reinforce the French army.

Petersberg, April 4. The emperor has ordered a levy of 200,000 men from the militia, for immediate service.

Constantinople, March 28. A part of the British fleet appear to have gone up the Mediterranean—they have, however, left 9 or 10 ships before Tenedos. The Turkish fleet has returned to Constantinople to disembark part of the land forces and to proceed from thence to the Black sea. The British fleet has taken possession of the island of Cyprus. The blockade of the Dardanelles has caused a great scarcity of provisions here.

NORFOLK, June 18. Commodore BARRON, on board the Chesapeake frigate, it is said, will sail this day for the Mediterranean.

The Melampus British frigate, which, a few days ago, went in quest of the brig Ceres, captured off our Capes by a small French privateer, returned to her anchorage on Tuesday, after an unsuccessful pursuit.

LONDON, May 2. We have received some numbers of the Monitor, from the 19th to the 23d last; and also of the Hamburg Correspondent to the 23d. General Bemingsen had reconnoitered the position of the French army on the 1st April. The emperor of Russia, and the grand duke Constantine, had joined him at the head of a reinforcement of 30 000 guards. A general engagement has probably taken place before this time. We stated in a former paper, the raising of the siege of Stralsund, and that the French were pursued in their retreat by the Swedes. The latter have suffered by their temerity. They were attacked on the 16th by Morier, who assembled all his force, raised the blockade of Colberg for that purpose, and drove them across the Peene, with the loss of six pieces of cannon and 1000 prisoners. The French have quitted Hamburg, and are endeavoring to form an army in the Mecklenburg territory, under the hourly terror of an expedition from this country.
