not unfrequently asserts that which is atterly false. The following extract, taken from the coffee-house desk, is calculated to excite no small degree of alarm ; it has nearly put a stop (momentary we are confident) to mer cantile transactions. We hope the delusion will be of short duration. Although we cannot be supposed to doubt, for a moment, the veracity, or the good intention of capt. Becatur ; nor can it be imagined that we are uninformed of the insolence and the barbarity of the commander of the Leopard ; yet we would ask those acquainted with British policy and British history, whether they believe that an English naval officer dare assume the awful responsibility of declaring war ? If the " British officers," as

stated in the coffee house letter, should declare war, and commence war operations by taking the Chesapeake, on receiving the president's proclamation, we will not hesi tate to say, that such must have been the express instructions from their government ; and we will most cordially join heart and hand in decisive measures against a people, thus lost to all sense of right, and who must then be denounced as the inhuman enemies of civilized man. But this, we do not anticipate ; however a British officer may threaten and "look big ;" however Rumor's many tongues may distort facts, and freight with lies each coming breeze, still we are incredulous ; we cannot yet believe that even those tyrants, against whom America so loudly, and with justice, complains, are the madmen represented.

We may be asked, has not the navy agent here received a draft from Norfolk for ammunition ? We are well acquainted with the fact; we know that several thousand balls, 24's and 32's have been sent ; and it is pleasing evidence of the spirit, the patriotism and the prudence of the people of Norfolk. Washington said -" to preserve peace, be prepared for war." 'Thus may the people of that place, even at the eleventh hour, prepare to meet the enemy ; and possibly deter him from the attack.

We may be permitted to give an instance of the magnifying powers of Rumor. In the Norfolk Herald of the 2d it is stated, that " upwards of twelve thousand citizens attended the town meeting at Baltimore" ! It was in consequence of no want of patriotism, that there were not 3,000 at that meeting.

A few days will dispel all doubt ; for when the proclamation shall have reached Lynhaven Bay, the British squadron will sail : either from the waters of the Chesapeake, or at the frigate of that name. Possibly the schr. Revenge is waiting the result; as she was ready to receive her orders on Saturday.

Extract of a letter from Washington, dated Saturday night, Oo'clock :

" A letter is this day received from capt. Decatur, (at Noriolk) stating that he had it from the most anquestionably authority, that the British officers have as erted positively more, sailed the day before. Left, ships Ri-sing Sun and Traveller, of Baltimore. Left at the Texel, 26th March, schooner -Bartlett, from Baltimore, just arrived ; and a number of others, of which captain S. bro't no list, and does not recollect their names. June 3, lat. 48, long. 13, spoke brig Abigal, of Wiscasset, from Savannah, for Dublin. 10th, lat. 40, long. 33, ship Boston, of Nantucket, on a whaling voyage. There was no certainty of any engagement having ta-ken place between the two armies.
