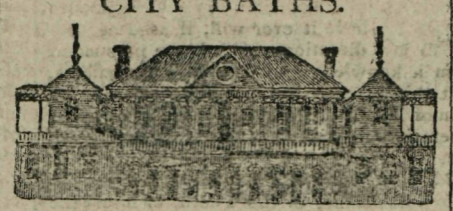

THAT I intend to apply to the justices of Baltimore county court, or some one of them, for the benefit of an act of assembly, passed at November session 1865, as well as of the supplement thereto, passed at the last session, entitled an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, to relieve me from debts I am unable to pay, after two months from this date.
