BY THIS DAY'S MAIL.

NEW-YORK, Sept. 29. Extract of a letter from Monte-Video, dated July 9.

We are in hourly expectation of hearing of the fall of Buenos Ayres, as the British army, composed of 9000 men were within three miles of the city on the 6th inst. and had taken all the out works. The Spaniards, as reports say, are about 25,000, chiefly composed of Paragua Indians, and but indifferently armed.

Arrived, The ship *Logan*, Myrick, 66 days from Amsterdam, gin, Butter, glassware &c. and a number of passengers.

Aug. 5, 9 leagues from Ushant, spoke the U. S. sloop of war *Wasp*, 4 days from Portsmouth for France. Aug. 20. lat. 45. 14. long. 26. 21, spoke brig *George*, 19 days from New-York for Bordeaux. Aug. 26, lat. 40. 47, long. 37. 50, spoke ship *Eliza*, 26 days from Liverpool for Savannah. Sept. 10, lat. 39. 25, long. 56. 54, spoke ship *Rolla*, Coit, of New-York, 30 days from New-Orleans, for Liverpool.

September 16, lat. 41, long. 65, 30 sp ke ship *Hero*, 21 days from New-York, for St. Thomas, then a prize to the British, and bound to Halifax, captured off Sandy-Hok.

September 24, lat. 38. 45, long. 70. 45, spoke schr. *Lucy*, from R. Island for Martinique.

The ship *Ocean*, Milward, 40 days from Liverpool, salt and crates. Sailed in company ship *Packet Baker*, for New-York; and *John*, Stiles, for Charleston.

Left ships *Alexander*, Wickham, and *Otis*, Leeds, b-th for N. Y. the 25th August. *Carmelite De Hart*, the 30th; *Eliza*, Crocker, the middle of September, and 100 others before rep. red. In coming out of Liverpool, spoke ships *Mount Vernon*, of Wiscasset, 29 days from Savannah, and ship *Grand Sackem* from Charleston.
