Ship Adamant, Beaty, of this port has arrived in the Straits of Sunda, from Elsinear.

The ship United States, capt. Moore, of and bound to Baltimore, from the Isle of France, owned by William Wilson and Sons, was captured on Sunday off Cape Henry, by the British ship of war Leopard, and sent to Halifax. Cargo, coffee, tea, pepper and cotton. The mate and crew were put on board the brig Lion, captain Harris.

Last evening we were favoured with the following extract of a letter from the consignees of the ship Delaware, to captain Thompson of said ship, dated

AMSTERDAM, Aug. 24, 1807.

"We have to inform you, that the American Consul, Mr. Bourne, told us to day, that he had received a verbal message from Mr. Munroe, the American minister in England, by which that gentleman advised that all American vessels that should be ready for sea, should get off as soon as possible North about; whereas those vessels that were not ready, should wait the turn of events."

Though peace is made between France and Russia, and between Prussia and France, still there seems to be no end to the march of troops to the different French armies which, to some politicians, certainly appears rather singular. But these politicians should take this consideration with them, that though there is an armistice between the Turks and Russians, there is no peace; that this must be negotiated under the mediation of France; and that it is still uncertain whether it will come to a peace or not. In the latter case (which Heaven forbid) it is probable that the French, as allies of the Turks, will take part with them; and, if Prussia remains neutral, the war will take quite a new direction.
