I to it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the mayor be, and he is hereby authorised and required to procure correct and accurate standards of all weights and measures established by law for Baltimore county, and the same to have adjust ed whenever necessary; and three persons be appointed within the city, keepers of the said standards, whose duty it shall be safely to keep and preserve the same, and to perform the several deties prescribed by this or any other ordinance of this corporation respecting weight and measures, who before they enter upon the duties of their appointment, shall give bond to the mayor and city council of Baltimore, in the penal sum of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of all the uties ap-pertaining to their office: and one of the said keepers shall be the keeper of the standards of weights, another the keeper of the standards of liquid measures, and the third, the keeper of the standards of dry and long measures.

II. And be it enac ed and ordained, That within three months after the said standards are procured, and the keepers appoined, of which the mayor shall cause notice to be given in the several newspapers of the city, all weights and measures used within the city or precincts of Baltimore, in the verding of articles, shall be regulated and adjuted by the said standard keepers, under a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars, to be paid by the person or persons owning or using the same, and when adjusted, shall be by the said standard keepers branded or stamped with the letters B S. meaning thereby Baltimore Standard, in such manner and on such parts of the said weights and mea-sures as in his judgment shall be most lasting and effectual in preventing and detecting frau-dulent practices or impositions in the use of such weights or measures And the like exami-nation and adjustment shall be repeated once in each year, and the branding or stamping renewed when necessary, under a penalty not exceeding twen-

VII. And be it enacted and ordained, That all scale beams used in the vending of articles in the city of Baltimore, or the precincts thereof, shall be adjusted and stamped by the keeper o the standard of weights, as weights are dio the standard of weights, as weights are di-rected to be stamped; and any person using scale beams in the city or precincts, not ad-justed and stamped as herein directed, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dol-lars, for each and every offence; and the said standard keeper shall be entitled to receive as a compensation for every scale beam, not excceding eighteen inches, twelve and a half cents; for every scale beam above eighteen inches and not exceeding thirty six inches, eighteen and three quarter cents; and for every scale beam above thirty six inches, twenty five cents, to be paid by the persons for whom the same shall be adjusted as aforesaid.
