But I greatly regret that the respectable gentlemen, who disapproved the proceedings, did not secede from the others, but permitted their names to be given to the public in such a manner as could not but be considered proof of their approbation. A spirited effort on their part might have prevented that disgraceful conduct, at least it would have destroyed its effect; but by their acquiescence, and the authority of their names, the censure was circulated more extensively, and the American character dishonored.
