And whereas there is reason to believe the said assassin is a certain John Whirlow, alias John Rigging, formerly committed to Worcester county gaol by said Judge Robins, to answer to a certain criminal charge, and who by two letters to said Judge Robins, threatened to assassinate him, which said Whirlow, alias Rigging, was on the day before the perpetration of said villainy supposed to be in Denton, inquiring when said Judge would return home.
