which was agreed to, ayes 70. Mr. Dawson, from the committee appoint ed a few days ago on the subject, presented

a report, concluding as follows : Resolved, That the secretary of war be authorised, under the direction of the president, to sell to those states that may wish to purchase, any arms belonging to the Uni-ted States, which may be sold without detriment to the public.

Resolved, That the sum of dollars be appropriated to establish a national founde ry at the city of Washington, for the pur-

pose of casting ordnance. The report was referred to a committee of the whole on Wednesday, and with the do-cuments accompanying it, ordered to be printed.

The house then went into committee of the whole on the bill authorising the erection of a bridge over the river Potomac; Mr Nelson's motion to strike out the first sec-tion (the essence of the bill) under conside-Tatio:

Mr. Nelson was making some observations against the bill ; when a message was receiv ed from the President of the U.S. transmitting a copy of the Proclamation, as re-quested by the house yesterday. Mr. Nelson was followed by Mr. Sloan and

Mr. K-y, on the same side ; and by Mr. Lewis in favor of the bill ; when the question was taken on striking out the first section, and lost. ayes 41, noes 78.

The bill was then read by sections, and several amendments made; when the com-mittee of the whole rose, reported the bill as amended, and obtained leave to sit again : -And then the house adjourned (half past 8 o'clock.)

This bill has been before congress for two or three successive sections. It was defeated last year in the senate, after having passed the house of representatives.
