CONGLESS.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

From our Correspondent. Washington, November 26.

Proceedings this dey.

Mr. Lewis from the committee to whom was recommitted the bill auth rising the erection of a bridge over the river Potomac, (for the purpose of making some amendments to it) reported the bill so amended. Referred to a committee of the whole tomorrow.

A petition was presented from praying congress to take off the duty on the bust lately imported into the U.S. to be erected in Washington City, to the memory of the officers who fell before Tripoli. Referred to a committee of ways and means.

The house then took up the bill extending the right of suffrage in the Mississippi Territory, and for other purposes, a debate of some length took place ; occasioned by the amendment offered by Mr. Bibb, providing that the law shall not take effect without the approbation of the state of Georgia. This debate took up nearly the whole of the day. The speeches of Mr. Sloan and Mr. Lyon occasioned great mirth in the house ; they were in answer to Mr. Gardinier, who contended that it was not always good policy to extend the elective franchise to men who possessed no interest in the soil, which doctrine also gave rise to some severe remarks from Mr. Poindexcer and Mr. Smilie.

It was contended in favor of the amendment, that this law would be extremely repugnant to the people of Georgia; that congress had no right to pass such a law, without the consent of Georgia, according to the articles of agreementand cession be tween that state and the United States ; that there was no evidence before the house, to shew that the people of the Mississippi Territory were dissatisfied with their pre-sent mode of government ; and that it would be improper to extend the elective
