We have received no advices from Washington to day: nothing having leaked out, relative to the dispatches. The only account from the seat of government, which we have seen, since our publication of Saturday, is the following, from the "Washington Federalist" of last day.

"Doctor Bullis, who arrived at New-York in the Revenge, reached the city three days since. He was the bearer of dispatches from the Government from our ministers in France and England. Those from France are said to be of peculiar interest and to have formed the subject of the confidential message on which both houses were engaged with closed doors yesterday. It would appear that our good friend Bonaparte has determined we shall remain no longer neutrals. It only, therefore, remains for Congress to determine with which power, France or England, they are to go war."

An American gentleman in Nantz, writing to his friend in New-York, under date of the 7th of Nov. says,

"From the king of Great Britain's proclamation I am induced to believe we shall have no war. This proclamation even in France is esteemed very moderate; for all the nations of Europe cry out against the principle of protecting military deserters, and this nation particularly holds the same principle with the English."
