

A detachment of about 200 men, from the garrison of Messina, maintains Scylla, under Colonel Robertson.

We know very little of the politics of the court of Palermo. As long as she possesses the dominion she exerts at present, they cannot be favorable to us. I believe, and am confidently assured, that the population of the country is highly favorable to us, and would with alacrity and joy throw themselves under our protection, should circumstances require us to assume the government of this island. We are at present actively employed in taking a statistical survey of that part of Sicily immediately in the vicinity of our posts, and I doubt not but that the result will prove the resources of the country to be very abundant under proper cultivation and encouragement. We are, of course, all activity at present, and with the characteristic eagerness of British soldiers, notwithstanding our inferior force, look forward with confidence and joy to the moment of the threatened attack.

FALMOUTH, March 22.
Arrived this evening the brig Nancy, Capt. Douglas, from Gibraltar; the White (brig), Ford, from do; the Boston, HAULING, from do; the Alligator, Robins, from do, being part of the homeward bound Mediterranean fleet, under convoy of his majesty's ship Sirius, 36 guns, and Diligence store-ship; which fleet (about 40 sail) were dispersed by signal on the 17th inst, in lat. 48, lon. 12, in consequence of two line-of-battle ships being close with them, and not answering the signals at the time those vessels last saw them. The enemy's ships were in chase of his majesty's ship Sirius and store-ship.

Also arrived the Danish ship African from the coast of Africa; with gum, honey, and gold dust, captured on the 3d. inst. by the *Jame* privateer of Mevegissy. Also arrived the ship *Croyden*, with mails from Jamaica, 50 days.

Dover, March 24.—Orders were received here this morning, for all the cutters to proceed to sea, without delay.—Sailed, the *Lively* and *Tartar* cutters; it is understood that the French ships are very much in want of men. Rendezvous have been open this month, and bounties offered, but hitherto without success.

THE REVIEW.—Sir, it will no doubt be gratifying to the patriotic citizens of distant districts, and indeed to our countrymen generally, to be informed that on the 2d May, the Baltimore brigade of volunteers furnished another strong argument in favour of the efficiency of our proper defenders. This brigade under the command of general Stricker, consists of the 5th, Lt. Col. Buchanan, 6th, Lt. Col. Biays, 27th, Lt. Col. Lowry, and 39th, Lt. Col. Mosher, Maryland militia, to which is attached four troops and as many companies of artillery. Nor are they the *cornstock*, *sansculotte* militia, of which we have so much from some states; but a well equipped, trained and uniform corps of as loyal, as ardent, and as respectable citizen-soldiers as these states can produce. Many of our most respectable and richest citizens are counted as privates in the ranks, and go through the arduous duty of the day without fatigue and without hesitation. This beautiful brigade, (at least 3,000 strong) was reviewed by major general S. Smith, who I undertake to say was well pleased with their appearance and performance. After the review a sham fight took place, which we are happy to say caused no material accident, except the injury sustained by an artilleryman in attempting to prime with a cartridge; some fire in the gun put off the cartridge (eight ounces) which unfortunately burnt his hand and face very much.
