

carrying logs which were used in the construction of the breast works as aforesaid became injured by the falling of a log which fell upon the body of the said Thomas J. Harris in such a manner as to cause a rupture, that the said Harris had to the best of their knowledge & belief seen sound & well up to the time of said accident. Affiants further declare that they were present & saw the said Harris at the time he met with the accident as aforesaid; that he was immediately sent to camp being carried there by two comrades who were detailed to accompany him; that in two or three days after the said injury was received the said Harris was sent to Hospital at City Point Va; that the said Harris was never able to perform regular duty as a soldier by reason of said injury up to the date of his discharge from the service on or about December 1865.
