

being wounded further than I have told you. He was not sick or in hospital at any time other than as I have stated to you. When he came back to the Company he was well and went on duty and he did not complain much, but did sometimes that he was stiff in his shoulders and legs. After he came from hospital he told me he had got wounded at the battle of Fort Gibraltar, in the shoulder and that one leg was hurt. Also I cannot say which leg it was. I did not see the wound at any time. He complained of the wound of shoulder a number of times, but I could not say how often he complained. He was away from the Company a long time with the Sharpshooters. The men for this duty were always selected from among those free from any disability. I have told you all I know about his being sick or wounded at any time in the service. I am not related to the claimant. I fully understand and comprehend the questions asked me and my answers have been correctly recorded.
