

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace.

State of Maryland, City of Baltimore, ss:

On this 19 day of June, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and

1909, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public, within and for the City and State aforesaid, Amanda E. Grace, aged 57 years, a

resident of Baltimore, State of Maryland

who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of

John E. Grace, who enlisted under the name of

John E. Grace, on the 19 day of March, A. D.

1864, as a U. S. C. Inf in Company 7, in the 39 Regiment of

Volunteers, and served at least ninety days in the late War

of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED

27 Dec 1865, and died June 15 1909. That he was not employed in

the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above.

That he was never employed in the military or naval service of the United States after the

day of 18

That she was married under the name of Amanda Harper to said John E. Grace

the 20 day of October A. D. 1881, by H. A. Carroll

at Baltimore, Baltimore, Md., there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had not

been previously married; that her said husband had not been previously married. (4)

(If either had been previously married, so state, and give date of death or divorce of former spouse.)

That she has not remarried since the death of the said John E. Grace

(Name of soldier or sailor.)

That the names and dates of birth of all the children of the soldier, now living, and under sixteen years of age, are as follows:

born 18, born 18, born 18, born 18

That she has not abandoned the support of any one of her children, but that they are still under her care or

maintenance. That No prior application for pension has been filed by herself or the soldier. But

(If prior application has been filed, either by soldier or widow, so state, giving number assigned to it.)

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of APR 19 1908, which was known as H. R. 15653 Sulloway Bill, and other acts granting pensions to widows for service aforesaid. She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation.
