Sir:-

In response to your letter of the 22nd instant, received the 25th, you are informed that you are now pensioned under the act of June 27, 1890, at the highest rate provided by said act, \$12 per month.

After you shall have attained the age of seventy years, you will be entitled to the rate of \$15 per month under the provisions of the act of February 6, 1907.

Your claim for pension under the general law, filed April 4, 1899, is considered as abandoned, for the reason that you have failed to furnish evidence to show origin in the service, and continuance since discharge of alleged rheumatism.

No relief can be given you at this time.
