

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION

ACT OF JUNE, 27, 1890.

To be Executed Before a Court of Record or some Officer Thereof Having Custody of its Seal.

State of Maryland, County of Baltimore, ss:

On this 14 day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety

personally appeared before me, Justice of the Peace William H. Bell

aged 37 years, a resident of the 1311 May Street, county of

Baltimore, State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law,

declares that he is the identical William H. Bell who was enrolled on the 17 day

of March, 1864, in Co K 30 Regt U.S.C.T.

as Private

in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was honorably discharged at Roanoke

Island N.C. on the 10 day of Dec, 1865. That he

is now unable to earn a support by reason of asthma Rheumatism

and weak eyes.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief per-  
manent; that he has applied for pension under application No. ; that he is a

pensioner under Certificate No. If a pensioner, the certificate number only need be given; if not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under  
the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, Geo. W. Vernon
