DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk.

State of Maryland County of Baltimore ss:

On this 15th day of August A. D. one thousand nine hundred and sixty, personally appeared before me Hiram Carpenter a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Hiram Carpenter, aged 55 years, a resident of the City of Baltimore.

State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Hiram Carpenter, who was enrolled on the 2nd week May, 1864, in Co. G. 28th Indiana U. Here state rank, company, and regiment in Military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.

United States in the war of the rebellion and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Petersburg, about 2nd week of August, 1864.

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above except in 1869 in Revenue Cutter Northern under Capt McGowan Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.

That he is totally unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of blindness Here name the disease or injuries from which disabled.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he has not applied for pension under application No. _____. That he is a pensioner under certificate No. _____.

If a pensioner, the Certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provision of the act of June 27, 1890, as amended by act of May 9, 1900.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

A. B. WEBB, of Washington, D. C.

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute this claim, the fee to be **TEN DOLLARS** as prescribed by law.
