

came through at Richmond between
me & two o'clock in the morning
long about March 11th 1864 about three
or four days after we came dark
to Yorktown Va. to camp I showed
them this lump in my groin.
At that time I had been ex-
cluded from all service by the
doctors then I showed these men
what injured I had received up in
that front which I showed them my
left knee and my left ankle was
swollen & painful I feel the effects
of it yet I injured my back at Ft
Mc Gorda. Also I was captured
on both sides in that same fall.
and left high and my back for
I fell in on a pile of old logs
and stumps and several men fell
in on top of me John Stuart fell
in there George Stanley fell in
at the same time. Also I

did fall in there. These men had
just returned didn't go any farther
they returned back to camp. They
then injured I received. was with
at Ft Garrison in front of Rich-
mond Va. carrying bags to
evacuate the road to go to
Richmond these injuries were
my right and left shoulders
also broke down at Ft. Fisher in
N.C. in 1865 with the same inju-
ries. Driven again and broke
down in Washington D.C.
dismissing the command of
1st Mc Hams and Ft Stanton
and I have been broke down
every since. I was discharged
out of the service a total cripple
and when I was down I had to
be helped up to still want to call
your attention that I filed my claim
under the old law and was
