

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

Act of June 27, 1890.

Note.—This can be executed before any officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer uses a seal, certificate of clerk of court is not necessary. If no seal is used, then such certificate must be attached.

STATE OF MARYLAND, CITY OF BALTIMORE, ss:

On this 11th day of Nov, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety seventy, personally appeared before me, a JUSTICE OF THE PEACE, within and for the City and State aforesaid Benjamin B. Smith, aged 56 years, a resident of the City of BALTIMORE, State of MARYLAND, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Benjamin B. Smith, who was ENROLLED on July 1863 in Co 5 4th Regt

[Here state rank, company, and regiment if in the Army, vessel, if in the Navy.]

in the service of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Baltimore Md, on the May 1866, day of May 1866.

That he is unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of Rheumatism, heart disease, injury hip & shoulder slight knee (Here name the disease or injuries from which disabled.) and double rupture - occurred at Ft McGruder Va in March 1864 fell while marching, injuring front & knee hip & back, which afterward developed into double hernia. It was on a night march stumbled over logs &c several men fell on me in the ditch -

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief of a permanent character. That he has applied for pension under application No. 409.898. That he is a

pensioner under Certificate No. _____

If not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.)

That he has never been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above _____

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, and he directs that the sum of TEN DOLLARS be paid to said attorney.
