I have never been injured in any <sup>war</sup> since my discharge from the service. Yes, I had one serious spell of sickness since my discharge - that was during Grant's first administration. I had chills and fever and undertook to doctor myself and took an over dose of medicine and it nearly killed me. I have been laid up with rheumatism several times since the war.
