I enlisted in Co. G. 19 U.S.C.T. soon after Jan'y 1, 1864  
and served in said Co. Regt to muster out of  
same in 1867.I was 3<sup>d</sup> Regt at muster out.

I was corporal in front of Petersburg, Va.

July 30, 1864, but was on detached duty at  
General Ferrero's Hd. Qrs. until about Jan'y  
1865. From which time I served with my  
company.

1864 First met claimant in the regiment  
at the "Yellow Tavern" front of Petersburg Va.  
he then told me he had been tramped  
on by the troops in the course of plowing  
fight of July 30, 1864, and that he had  
been wounded by a bayonet <sup>in the</sup> calf  
of left leg in same fight, also a skull wound  
of left knee. I saw, in service, the scars  
of the wounds of left knee, and calf of  
left leg. Know that claimant was lame  
in service from effects of wounds of left  
leg. Remember while in Texas that  
claimant had scurry, and that he broke  
out in sores, on his legs, and arms.
